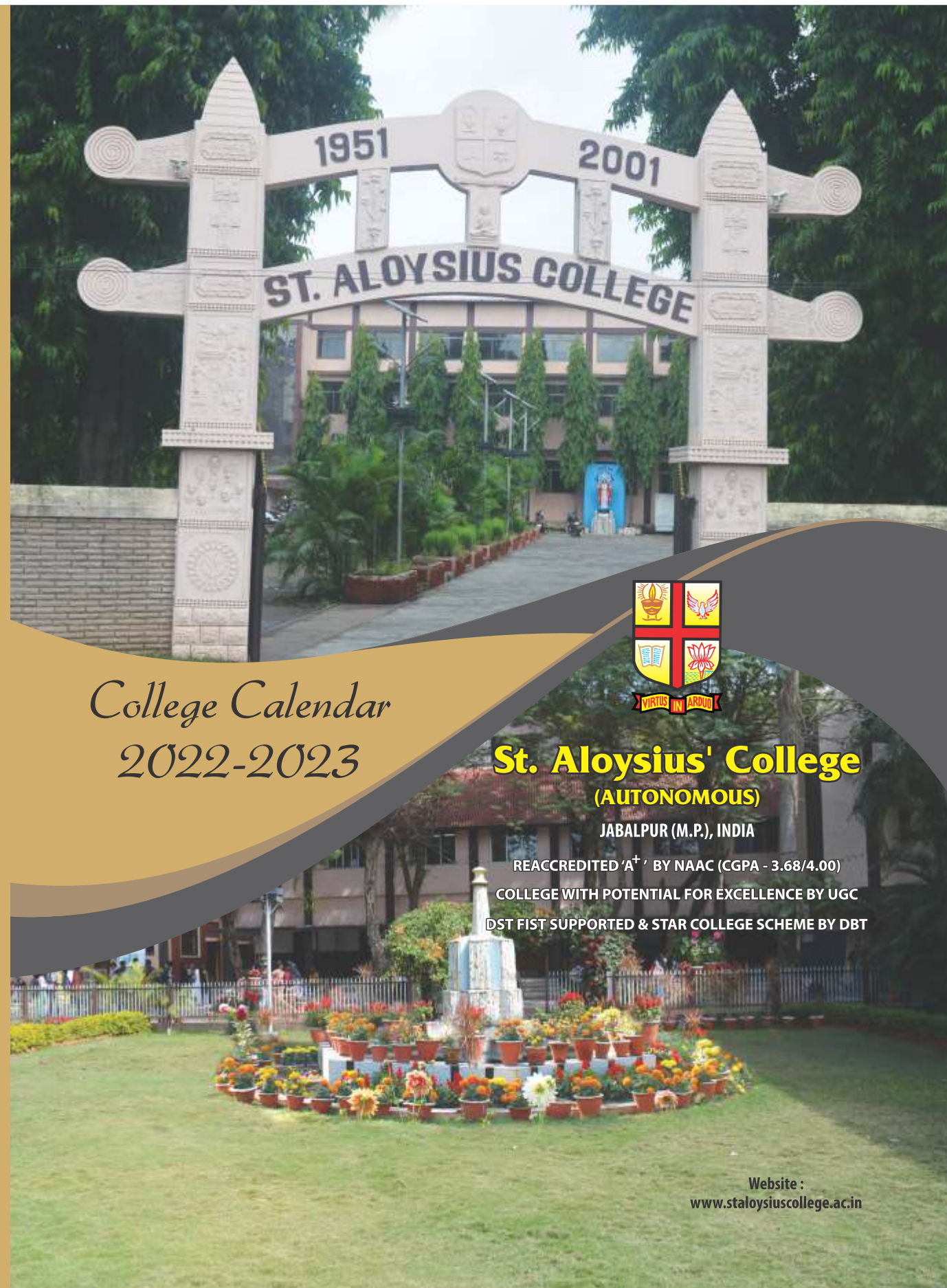

### LAMP

It is a symbol of intelligence and spirit. The lamps are shaped according to their function-religion of seculars. They are perpetually burning lamps in the shrines and temples. ### EAGLE

### BOOK

Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, our patron saint, was a precocious child who had a spiritual awakening at the age of 7. He is adorned for his courage and compassion in the face of an incurable disease. As student at Roman College, he died as a result of caring for the victim of plague.

Saint Aloysius known for his purity, prayerfulness and service, led many to consider him as a saint. His attributes were a Lily, referring to innocence, a cross, referring to piety and sacrifice, and a rosary referring to his devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

As a young adult, and after a prolonged battle with his family, in 1729, Saint Aloysius was declared to be the patron saint of young students, he was beatified in 1605, and was canonized in 1726.

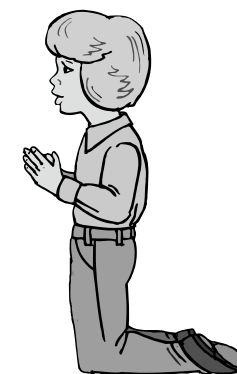

### 3.1.1 Book Bank:

- Book Bank facility is available only for ST/SC and economically poor students.
- Students who avail the Book Bank facility must return the books immediately after the exams, failing which they will have to pay a fine of Rs. 1/- per day.

**3.1.2 Reference Library:** Reference books cannot to be issued from the library. Students can use them in the library itself.

### 3.1.3 Digital library

Digital library software is a fully web based application and users can avail from anywhere e-resources can be accessed from the website [www.staloyuscollege.in](http://www.staloyuscollege.in). All enrolled students are given a username and password to access the facility. Information from the digital library server is available in different digital formats such as pdf, doc, power point files, excel files, html, chm files, images, videos and many more. All these documents can be accessed under different categories like e-books, cds/dvds collections, teachers collection, college library books, best projects assignments, study material, teachers video lecture, notes etc.

### 3.1.4 Digital center

The digital center of the college is one of the added features which assists the learning and progress of those students who do not have technological resources. The center also facilitates the access to all to access the e-resources of the college. Digital age has brought a tremendous change in the way information is stored and accessed. It is marked by three distinct features: abundance, currency and easy access of information. St. Aloysius College gives the facility to access various e-resources in one place using digital center. Students can access INFLIBNET, DEL-NET, e-books, e-journals and video lectures. Students can also access college central Library Database through Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) in various categories like Subject, Title, Author, and Publisher, and avail the book transaction facility. **3.2 Physical Facilities**

St. Aloysius College makes every effort to ensure adequate physical infrastructural facilities to students, promote a teaching learning environment, classrooms with DLP, well-equipped laboratories, and the Central Instrumentation Centre, provide a platform for inclusive education. In addition, there is a conference room, language lab, computing facilities, library, departmental rooms, a fitness center for men and women and comfort rooms for staff and students. The college upgrades the infrastructure for the conduction of online classes, 31 classrooms were transformed into tech-enabled rooms with video conferencing support 27 laptops with adequate configuration. 31 high-resolution webcams. The college is equipped with indoor game facilities for chess, badminton, and table tennis. The outdoor games facilities are shared by the college and the school, belonging to the same management. Cultural events, seminars, conferences, workshops, and yoga/Zumba/martial art, are held in a multi-purpose auditorium 'Perna' equipped with a high tech sound system, lighting, and DLP.

**3.3 Fitness Centre**

  - (d) Permanent Total Disablement from injuries other than those named above = 100% i.e. Rs. 1.00 Lac

from 1st November onwards only.

**2. Railway Concession :** Student shall submit application for railway concession in the prescribed form 10 days in advance. The place mentioned in the column of permanent address of the admission form shall be taken as the students home town.

**3. Teacher Guardian Scheme :** For the all round development and better academic growth of students the college has the teacher guardian scheme. From time to time teacher guardian meetings are held through which information of activities of the college is given.

**4. Vivekanand Career and Placement Cell :** Students are given information on competitive exams, youth entrepreneurship and placement through this cell.

**5. Women Redressal Cell :** The women redressal cell will look into problems of female students. The college has also provided a suggestion box for the same.

**6. Overseas/International Student Cell :** The Overseas/ International Student Cell looks into the academic requirements of the overseas/international students.

## 6. College Autonomy

St. Aloysius College, Jabalpur has been conferred autonomous status by the UGC from 2007. Autonomy is a system of academic freedom, enabling them to achieve their quality goals and objectives. Under autonomy, the college is permitted to formulate its own syllabus, adopt innovative methods of pedagogy and establish its progression system. The College is free to review courses & programmes of study & syllabi. Under autonomy the college evolves new methods of assessment of students performance, conduct examinations & declare results.

### 6.1 Examination and Evaluation

- The minimum duration of the undergraduate degree programme shall be of three academic years i.e. six semesters, whereas that of undergraduate degree leading to Honours/ Research shall be of four

academic years i.e. Eight semesters.

Provided also that when the result of the candidate is withheld for non-compliance of certain conditions on his part (e.g. non submission of Migration Certificate or Original documents , case of unfair means etc.) the time limit for accepting his form would not be extended on this account, i.e. it would be within 15 days after the date of declaration of the main result.

- (c) The fee for revaluation shall be Rs 730/- per answer books which is not refundable. Provided that if the revaluation has not been done due to unavoidable circumstances, full amount (Except processing charges) of fees paid for revaluation will be refunded for each answer books.
- (d) The Scrutiny /Retotaling of marks shall be done before the answer-books are sent for revaluation without the candidate applying for it and if any change is found necessary action to revise the marks will be taken accordingly and revaluation will be undertaken if the candidate still desires to get his answer -books revalued.
- (e) The result of revaluation shall be communicated to the candidate. even if there is no change in the marks through college website.

• **Rules for Scrutiny (Retotaling of Answer Books)**

- (a) Any candidate, who has appeared at any year end examination of the college, may apply to the Principal for the scrutiny of his marks on the written paper in any subject and rechecking of his results.
- (b) Such application must be made in the form prescribed by the college so as to reach the Principal within 15 days from the date of the declaration of the result. Provided that when the result of the candidate is withheld for non compliance of certain conditions on his part (e.g. non-submission of Migration certificate of Original documents, case of unfair means etc). The time limit for accepting his form would not be extended i.e. it would be within 15 days from the date of declaration of result.
- (c) Such application must be accompanied with a fee of Rs.500/- for each answer books to be scrutinized, This fee shall be Non-Refundable.

- Provided that of Scrutiny (Retotaling has not been done due to unavoidable circumstances, the full amount (Except processing charges) for Scrutiny/Retotaling will be refunded for each answer books.

**7.1** A student for the undergraduate degree examination will be required to complete 160 credits. To enable multiple entry and exit points in the academic programmes, qualifications such as certificate, diploma, and degree are organized in a sense of levels in an ascending order from level 5 to level 8 . The students should opt one major, one minor, one elective and one Ability enhancement course to successfully complete one semester. Below table show the credit Requirement for qualifying the various academic levels

The credit can be calculated as follows

- On Completing all the requirements for the award of the undergraduate certificate/diploma/degree the CGPA will be calculated and this will be indicated in the certificate/diploma/degree. - 2. Attendance:** Students are expected to attend College regularly. 75% attendance in every subject is a must. Defaulters may please note that they will not be allowed to appear in the main examination. If the Student is absent for 15 consecutive days without Prior information then his/her admission will be cancelled.

**उपस्थिति :** विद्यार्थियों से यह आशा की जाती है कि वे महाविद्यालय के प्रत्येक विषय में 75% की उपस्थिति दें। इससे कम उपस्थिति पाई जाने पर मुख्य परीक्षा की कक्षा में बैठने नहीं दिया जाएगा। छात्र 15 दिनों तक लगातार बिना सूचना के अनुपस्थित हैं तो उस दशा में छात्र/छात्रा का प्रवेश निरस्त किया जा सकता है।

- 3. Campus & Parking :** Campus should be green, clean & polythene free. Vehicles should be parked at the cycle-stand on payment and never be on the road.

**महाविद्यालय परिसर एवं पार्किंग** — महाविद्यालय परिसर सदैव हरा — भरा, स्वच्छ एवं Polythene मुक्त रखा जाये। वाहनों को Cycle Stand पर निर्देशित किराया देकर रखा जाये एवं उन्हें कदापि सड़क पर न खड़ा किया जाये।

- 4. Notice-Boards :** It is mandatory for the students to read the Notice Boards and collage website regularly.

**सूचना पटल :** विद्यार्थियों के लिए नियमित रूप से सूचना पटल पर प्रकाशित सूचनाओं को पढ़ना अनिवार्य है।

- 5. Classroom :** College classrooms should be kept clean. Spitting, scribbling on the desks and walls, throwing paper around, pasting posters etc. are strictly forbidden. During free periods students are advised not to sit in the classrooms but make use of the library, reading room or common room. The Class Representatives are expected to take care of the switch boards as well as the cleanliness of the classroom.

- 6. Identity Cards :** The Students Identity Card issued by the college is an important document to be carried by the students in the campus. It should be produced/surrendered on demand to any official of the institution. In the absence of the I-Card students shall not be issued library books, transfer certificates and caution money. The students will not be permitted to participate in any college function without the I - Card. If the I - Card is lost, the college authorities and the nearest police station have to be informed immediately. A Duplicate I - Card will be issued if a photocopy of the FIR is produced and on payment of Rs. 100/-

**पहचान पत्र :** महाविद्यालय द्वारा हर छात्र को एक पहचान पत्र प्रदान किया जाएगा व महाविद्यालय के प्रांगण में दाखिले के लिए पहचान पत्र अनिवार्य है। महाविद्यालय में किसी भी कार्यालयीन कार्य के लिए परिचय पत्र elxkजा सकता है। छात्र के पास पहचान पत्र न पाए जाने पर, पुस्तकालय से पुस्तकें, ट्रांसफर सर्टिफिकेट, अवधान राशि व महाविद्यालय के किसी भी कार्यक्रम में प्रतिभागिता नहीं दी जाएगी। पहचान पत्र खो जाने पर महाविद्यालय और निकटतम पुलिस थाने में सूचना दी जाए। एफ.आई.आर. की फोटोकॉपी देने पर एक डुप्लीकेट आई. कार्ड. 100 रु. के मूल्य पर दिया जायेगा।

- 7. Dress Code :** Students are expected to be circumspect in their dress and demeanor. All of them should follow the dress code formal shirts & trousers for boys and Churidar/ Salwar Kamiz with dupatta for girls.

- 8. Postal Address :** No letters are to be directed to the college address. Any change in the residential address, phone number and e-mail address must be brought to the notice of the college office in writing.

- 9. Grievance Redressal Cell :** The Grievance Redressal Cell will look into matters regarding the functioning of the college, the academic and

extra curricular activities. Any suggestion regarding the same may be put in the suggestion box or students may approach the teacher incharge.

**10. Transfer Certificate :** To obtain transfer certificate the student shall take No Dues certificate from the respective Department & Library and pay the prescribed fee.

**11. Refund of Caution Money :**

- Caution money shall be refunded after obtaining transfer certificate.

- To obtain caution money the student shall submit an application along with original admission receipt between 5th to 15th Feb of every year.

अवधान राशि प्राप्त करने के लिए विद्यार्थी अपना आवेदन पत्र मूल प्रवेश शुल्क रसीद के साथ 5 से 15 फरवरी के बीच प्रस्तुत करें।

Caution money is refundable within 3 years of leaving the college.

अवधान राशि कॉलेज छोड़ने के 3 वर्ष के भीतर ही दी जा सकेगी।

**12. Punctuality :** Students are expected to be punctual and make this habit a part of their character. They should be present in the college at 7:45 am (Morning Shift)/ 1:15pm (Afternoon Shift).

On joining the college a student becomes liable to abide by all the rules and regulation of the College. The decision of the Principal shall be final in all matters of discipline and enforcement of rules.

## RAGGING

Ragging is a criminal offence as per the Supreme Court Verdict. It is an offence under penal code and under section 16 of the Karnataka Education Act, 1983 (Karnataka Act No. 1, of 1995), which defines ragging as :

"Causing, inducing, compelling or forcing a student, whether by way of practical joke or otherwise, to do any act which detracts from human dignity or violates his/her person or exposes him/her to ridicule from doing any lawful act. By intimidating wrongfully restraining, wrongfully confining, or injuring him/her or by using criminal force on him/her or by holding out to him/her any threat of intimidating wrongful confinement, injury or the use of criminal force."

"Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in this institution. The institute shall take strict action including criminal proceeding and cancellation of admission against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging and the burden of proof shall hereby lie on the perpetrator of the alleged ragging and not on the victim. "An offence of Ragging may be charged either on a written complaint by the affected or on independent finding of the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009."

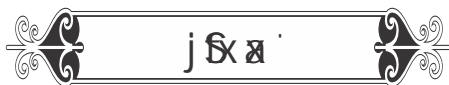
### Punishable elements constituents of Ragging

- Abetment/instigation to ragging.
- Criminal conspiracy to rag.
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging.
- Public nuisance created during ragging.
- Injury to body, causing hurt / mental trauma or grievous hurt.
- Physical Extortion or Psychological humiliation
- Any act / abuse by spoken words, e-mails, snail mails, blogs, public insults etc.
- Any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student

Punishments against Ragging :

- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits
- Forfeiting from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process
- Withholding of results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of Admission.
- Rustication from the institution for a period, ranging from 1 to 3 years.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period.
- Fine of Rs. 25000/-.
- Collective Punishment : When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

The fresher/junior students are hereby instructed that they should move in groups within the academic areas/campus, should not respond to the calls from seniors, **should not participate in any kind of "fresher party" anywhere outside the campus**, desist from doing anything against their will even if ordered by the seniors. They are hereby assured that they have nothing to fear as the institution cares for them and shall not tolerate any atrocities against them.



माननीय सर्वोच्च न्यायालय के आदेश दिनांक 27-11-06 संदर्भ एसएलपी 2495/06 केरल विश्वविद्यालय विरुद्ध प्राचार्य की परिषद् तथा एसएलपी क्रमांक 24296/2004 डब्ल्यू पी (सीआरसी) नं. 173/2006 तथा एसएलपी क्रमांक 14356/2005 के अनुसार रैगिंग एक दण्डनीय अपराध है। महाविद्यालय या छात्रावास परिसर में या अन्यत्र कहीं भी रैगिंग लेना पूरी तरह प्रतिबंधित है। रैगिंग के लिए दोषी विद्यार्थी को महाविद्यालय से निष्कासित किया जाएगा व उसके विरुद्ध कठोर निषेधात्मक कार्यवाही की जाएगी। वरिष्ठ विद्यार्थी इसका ध्यान रखें।

**दण्ड** - मध्यप्रदेश विश्वविद्यालय अधिनियम 1973 के अधीन बनाये गये अध्यादेश क्र. 7 की धारा 13 के अनुसार महाविद्यालय परिसर या बाहर अनुशासन भंग किये जाने पर दोषी विद्यार्थी के विरुद्ध निम्नानुसार दण्ड का प्रावधान है -

1. कक्षाओं से निलम्बन।
2. महाविद्यालय से निष्कासन।
3. विवि/स्वाशासी परीक्षा में सम्मिलित होने से रोकना।

रैगिंग में संलिप्त विद्यार्थी के विरुद्ध कठोर दण्डात्मक कार्यवाही महाविद्यालय और छात्रावास से निष्कासन, छात्रवृत्ति तथा अन्य प्रदत्त लाभ वापस लेने की कार्यवाही

के अलावा अर्धदण्ड और सार्वजनिक क्षमाचाना का भी प्रावधान रहेगा।

## Code of Conduct (नियमावली)

- (a) Every student shall maintain the decorum of the College and be polite to the Principal, Vice-Principal, teachers, other staff and peers.
- (b) Every student shall totally concentrate on his/her studies and should actively participate in academic/non academic college functions.
- (c) Students are expected to maintain peace, harmony & cleanliness in the college. Admission shall be cancelled for those who cause damage to college property including building, library, laboratories, hostel etc.
- (d) Students shall not indulge in any political activity in the college campus. Violence of any kind shall not be tolerated.
- (e) If students have any difficulty that needs to be addressed they can put it through their representative in a disciplined and peaceful manner to the teacher, if very necessary to the principal. They can also contact their mentor teacher or the grievance redressal cell. However they cannot by any means contact any outsiders.
- (f) Students shall not involve in any immoral / criminal activity. In case of any such involvement strict action shall be taken.
- (g) After admission if a student is found having submitted false documents

/ given false information / deliberately hidden important facts or if he/she has been admitted inadvertently then his/her admission can be terminated.

- (h) If a student leaves the college in mid session or is terminated mid session the student shall be refunded only the caution money. No other fees is refundable.
- (I) No student shall use his/her mobile phone in the class. If he/she is found doing so his/her phone shall be confiscated.

### (नियमावली)

- (I) छात्र महाविद्यालय की शालीनता को बनाए रखे प्राचार्य, उप प्राचार्य, प्राध्यापकगण और कार्यालय अधिकारियों के साथ विनम्र व्यवहार रखें।
- (II) विद्यार्थी अपने अध्ययन का ध्यान रखें और विद्यार्थी व गैर अकादमिक गतिविधियों और कार्यक्रमों में सक्रिय प्रतिभागी बने।
- (III) छात्र महाविद्यालय में शांति, तालमेल एवं स्वच्छता बनाए रखें। छात्र महाविद्यालय की संपत्ति, पुस्तकालय, प्रयोगशाला एवं छात्रावास में किसी प्रकार की क्षति पहुँचाता है, तो उसका प्रवेश निरस्त कर दिया जाएगा।
- (IV) छात्र को किसी भी प्रकार की राजनीतिक गतिविधि या तोड़ फोड़ में लिप्त नहीं पाया जाना चाहिए। किसी भी प्रकार की हिंसा असहनीय होगी।
- (V) किसी भी प्रकार की समस्या निवारण हेतु छात्र अपने कक्षा प्रतिनिधि के माध्यम से प्राध्यापक को बताएं, यदि अति आवश्यक है तो प्राचार्य को सूचित करें, अथवा mentor प्राध्यापक व शिकायत समिति के पास जा सकता है। किसी भी स्थिति में छात्र बाहरी व्यक्ति से समस्या निवारण हेतु संपर्क ना करें।
- (VI) अनैतिक व आपराधिक गतिविधियों में संलग्न पाए जाने पर छात्र के प्रति कठोर कार्यवाही की जाएगी।
- (VII) जाली प्रमाण पत्रों के आधार पर या गलत जानकारी देकर, जानबूझकर छिपाये गये प्रतिकूल तथ्यों या प्रशासनिक अथवा कार्यालयीन असावधानीवश किसी आवेदक को यदि प्रवेश मिल

जाता है, तब संज्ञान में आने पर ऐसे प्रवेश को निरस्त करने का पूर्ण अधिकार प्राचार्य को होगा।

- (VIII) प्रवेश के बाद सत्र के दौरान विद्यार्थी द्वारा महाविद्यालय छोड़ने या उसका प्रवेश निरस्त होने अथवा उसके निष्कासन की दशा में विद्यार्थी को सुरक्षा राशि अलावा अन्य कोई शुल्क वापस नहीं किया जायेगा।
- (IX) कक्षा में कोई विद्यार्थी मोबाइल फोन का उपयोग नहीं करेंगे अगर मोबाइल फोन का उपयोग करते पाये जाने पर तो उनका फोन जब्त कर लिया जायेगा
