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
mechanism have facilitated quick and quality administration.

#### **3.1.1 Book Bank:**

- 3.1.2 Reference Library: Reference books cannot be issued from the library. Students can use them in the library itself.

### 3.1.3 Digital library

Digital library software is a fully web based application and users can avail from anywhere E-resources can be accessed from the website www.staloysiuscollege.in. All enrolled students are given a username and Password to access the facility. Information from the digital library server is available in different digital formats such as pdf, doc, power point files, excel files, html, chm files, images, videos and other. All these documents can be accessed under different categories like e-books, cds/dvds collections, teachers collection. college library books, best projects assignments, study material, teachers video lecture, notes etc.

### 3.1.4 Digital center

The digital center of the college is one of the added features which assists the learning and progress of those students who do not have technological resources. The center also facilitates the access to access the e-resources of the college. The digital age has brought about a tremendous change in the way information is stored and accessed. It is marked by three distinct features: abundance, currency and easy access of information. St. Aloysius College provides the facility to access various e-resources in one place using the digital center. Students can access INFLIBNET, DEL-NET, ebooks, e-journals and video lectures. Students can also access the college central Library Database through the Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) in various categories like Subject, Title, Author, and Publisher and avail the book transaction facility. Under teacher's collection, the provision of accessing e-lectures from the college website can also be use by students.

#### 3.1.6 Reading Room:

St. Aloysius College has a spacious reading room for reference angle has journals, news-letter and magazines to keep the students continuously updated about the world around them. The college subscribes to 86 National and international journals and 55 Magazines. The Reading from also subscribes to Newsletters and 17 News papers which can be availed by the student in his/ her free period.

#### 3.2 Physical Facilities

St. Aloysius College makes every effort to ensure adequate physical infrastructural facilities to students and promotes a teaching-learning environment and classrooms with DLP, well-equipped laboratories, and the Central Instrumentation Centre. If provides a platform for inclusive education. In addition, there is a conference room, language lab, computing facilities, library, departmental rooms, a fitness center for men and women and comfort rooms for staff and students. The college upgrades the infrastructure for the conduction of online classes, There are 31 classrooms which were transformed into tech-enabled rooms with video conferencing supported by 27 laptops with adequate configuration and 31 highresolution webcams. The college is equipped with indoor game facilities for chess, badminton, and table tennis. The outdoor games facilities are shared by the college and the school, since they belong to the same management. Cultural events, seminars, conferences, workshops, and yoga/Zumba/matrtial art, are held in a multi-purpose auditorium 'Prerna' equipped with a high tech sound system, lighting, and DLP.

#### 3.3 Fitness Centre

Stay fit and Stay Positive with 16 workstations. The college offers gym facilities to students and staff, providing a wide range of modern equipments to help them be mentally and physically fit. There are two seperate gym facilities for men and women.

#### 3.4 Hostel

Hostel facilities are provided for both boys and girls. Well furnished, spacious rooms indoor and outdoor games, reading room, safe drinking water, separate study hall and hot water facility for students are also provided. The hostel administration staff ensures a clean and healthy mess, well disciplined atmosphere, special individual care It also provides personality and skill development sessions for the students.

#### 3.5 Counseling Center

The college offers regular career counseling to students. Students having difficulties in learning and those with emotional needs, career related queries and health problems can make use of the counseling facilities. Regular counseling sessions are undertaken to hone the various personal and career oriented needs of the students. Personality development, life skills enhancement, interpersonal skills, effective work management are certain core areas of the Counseling cell of the college.

#### 3.6 Placement Cell

The Placement Cell at St. Aloysius was established in the year 2004. Since its inception it has grown manifold and it continually works on upgrading and preparing students to embark upon their career paths. Various In-house training sessions and workshops are organized and conducted to train the students and enhance their communication skills, public speaking, logical & critical reasoning and aptitude. The Placement cell also conducts several career guidance sessions by industry experts and career talks by the multifaceted alumni of the college so that the students can gain better real world insights through them. Along with the campus drives, various internships are also provided to the students to gain hands on experience which would further help them in moving towards a purposeful and fulfilling career.

#### 3.8 Provisions for Students with Disabilities:

The college has all possible provisions in order to create a barrier free environment in consonance towards the needs of diverse disability groups of students, Utmost care and importance is given to their needs regarding safety, convenience and usability. A Lift is installed in the campus with adequate space and dimensions making all the floors accessible to Divyangs. Ample space is allocated for persons using mobility devices, e.g. wheelchairs, crutches and walkers, as well as those walking with the assistance of other persons. Utmost importance is given to dimensions of wheelchairs been used along with the range of reach (forward and side; with, or without obstruction) of a person in a wheelchair. Disabled friendly washroom is provided for the use of handicapped with wash basin near the

entrance for the handicapped. The college also provides Human Assistance for the movement of wheelchair around the campus. Classes are recorded and are then given to the visually impaired students for their learning and understanding. Utmost care is taken for the removal of all protruding objects and sufficient walking space for safe walking acts.

#### 3.9 Central Instrumentation Centre

The Central Instrumentation Center is a hub of state of art instruments which promote inclusive education of latest technologies needed for performing high quality research in physical and life sciences. It is open to learners, scholars, researchers & academicians. Sophisticated Analytical instrument Facility (SAIF) has started as an extension of CIC. The instrumentation facility can be availed by anyone at stipulated charges.

Any accident must be reported within 24 hours to the Principal for claim with following documents:

- (c) Punchnama Document Needed for Disablement Case:
- 1. FIR Report
- 2. Doctor's Certificate regarding % of Disablement.
- 3. Punchnama Insurance scheme will be applicable for 1st year students

from 1st November onwards only.

- **2. Railway Concession:** Students shall submit an application for railway concession in the prescribed form 10 days in advance. The place mentioned in the column of permanent address of the admission form shall be taken as the students home town.
- **3. Teacher Guardian Scheme :** For the all round development and better academic growth of students the college has the teacher guardian scheme. From time to time teacher guardian meetings are held through which information of activities of the college is given.
- **4. Vivekanand Career and Placement Cell:** Students are given information on competitive exams, youth entrepreneur ship and placement through this cell.

# 6. College Autonomy

St. Aloysius College, Jabalpur has been conferred autonomous status by the UGC from 2007. Autonomy is a system of academic freedom, enabling them to achieve their quality goals and objectives. Under autonomy, the college is permitted to formulate its own syllabus, adopt innovative methods of pedagogy and establish its progression system. The College is free to review courses & programmes of study & syllabi. Under autonomy the college evolves new methods of assessment of students performance, conducts examinations & declares results.

#### **6.1 Examination and Evaluation**

The minimum duration of the undergraduate degree programme shall be
of three academic years i.e. six semesters, whereas that of undergraduate
degree leading to Honours/ Research shall be of four academic years i.e.
Eight semesters.

- The maximum duration for completing the Undergraduate degree programme & Undergraduate degree Programme (Honours/Research) for regular students shall be 6 semesters and 8 semesters respectively.
- After completing the requirements of a three year Bachelor's Degree, candidates who meet a minimum CGPA of 7.5 shall be allowed to continue studies in the fourth year of the undergraduate programme to pursue and complete the Bachelor's (Honours/Research) Degree.
- A student shall be declared to have successfully completed the first semester if he/she acquires 6 credits in Core Course of the major subject, 6 credits in Core Course of the minor subject, 4 credits in Generic Elective and 4 credits in Ability Enhancement course (AEC).
- Total marks obtained in Semester-End Examinations and continuous evaluation will be considered for awarding the grade in the course.
- If the marks obtained by the student in a course are less than the minimum cut-off percentage of marks, then F grade will be awarded to the student. Otherwise the grades will be awarded as mentioned in the table below.

- The student will be promoted to the next semester if he/she secures at least half of the total credits in a semester. In case the student secures less than half of the total credit in any semester, then the student will be declared fail in that semester, and will be asked to repeat the entire semester, and that semester will be treated as a zero semester. In such case the student will not be promoted to the next semester.
- If the student secures at least half of the total credits in a semester, then the student fails in some courses offered in that semester, then the student will be provisionally promoted to the next semester with ATKT (Allowed To Keep Term) in those courses in which the student fails.
- If the student fails to pass in all the courses in the ATKT examination the provisional promotion will be terminated but the student will be given second chance to pass the failed courses.
- If the student does not successfully complete the concerned semester even after the aforesaid second chance, in that case the student shall be treated as Failed in that semester and will be asked to repeat the entire semester and that semester will be treated a zero semester.
- Repetition of a theory/practical course is allowed only to those candidates who get F or Ab grade in the course or has failed in the semester. The student will have to pay the prescribed fee for repeating the course.
- The provision for review of answer books in the semester system will be available as per the existing rules of the university.

### Revaluation, Scrutiny & Review of the Answer Book. Rules for Revaluation

- (a) A candidate whose result of main examination has been declared, may apply to the Principal for the revaluation of his answer books (only theory examination), In the form (prescribed by the (college) within 15 days from the date of declaration of results with the fee prescribed.
- (b) Provided that no candidate shall be allowed to have more than two answer books revalued. Provided also that no revaluation shall be allowed in case of practical, field work, seminar, sessional work, CCE/IA test and

thesis/ dissertation/ project report submitted at the examination and also for the supplementary examination. Provided also that when the result of the candidate is withheld for noncompliance of certain conditions on his part (e.g. non submission of Migration Certificate or Original documents , case of unfair means etc.) the time limit for accepting his form would not be extended on this account, i.e. it would be within 15 days after the date of declaration of the main result.

- (c) The fee for revaluation shall be Rs 730/- per answer books which is not refundable. Provided that if the revaluation has not been done due to unavoidable circumstances, the full amount (except processing charges) of fees paid for revaluation will be refunded for each answer book.
- (d) The Scrutiny / Retotaling of marks shall be done before the answer books are sent for revaluation without the candidate applying for it and if any change is found necessary action to revise the marks will be taken accordingly and revaluation will be undertaken if the candidate still desires to get his answer books revalued.
- (e) The result of revaluation shall be communicated to the candidate. even if there is no change in the marks through the college website.

### Rules for Scrutiny (Retotaling of Answer Books)

- (a) Any candidate, who has appeared at any year end examination of the college, may apply to the Principal for the scrutiny of his marks on the written paper in any subject and rechecking of his results.
- (b) Such application must be made in the form prescribed by the college so as to reach the Principal within 15 days from the date of the declaration of the result. Provided that when the result of the candidate is with held for non compliance of certain conditions on his part (e.g. non submission of Migration certificate of Original documents, case of unfair means etc). The time limit for accepting his form would not be extended i.e. it would be within 15 days from the date of declaration of result.
- (c) Such applications must be accompanied with a fee of Rs.500/- for each answer books to be scrutinized, This fee shall be Non-refundable.
- Provided that of scrutiny (retotaling has not been done due to unavoidable circumstances, the full amount (except processing charges) for scrutiny/retotaling will be refunded for each answer book.



A student for the undergraduate degree examination will be required 7.1 to complete 160 credits. To enable multiple entry and exit points in the academic programmes, qualifications such as certificate, diploma, and degree are organized in a sense of levels in an ascending order from level 5 to level 8.

The students should opt one major, one minor, one elective and one Ability enhancement course to successfully complete one semester. The below table shows the credit requirement for qualifying the various academic levels

On Completing all the requirements for the award of the undergraduate certificate / diploma/ degree the CGPA will be calculated and this will be indicated in the certificate / diploma / degree. 

Defaulters may please note that they will not be allowed to appear in the main examination. If the Student is absent for 15 consecutive days without prior information then his/her admission will be cancelled.

- 12- Punctuality: Students are expected to be punctual and make this habit a part of their character- They should be present in the college at 7:45 am (Morning Shift) / 1:15pm (Afternoon Shift).

Ragging is a criminal offence as per the Supreme Court Verdict. It is an offence under penal code and under section 116 of the Karnataka Education Act, 1983 (Karnataka Act No. 1, of 1995), which defines ragging as:

"Causing, inducing, compelling or forcing a student, whether by way of practical joke or otherwise, to do any act which detracts from human dignity or violates his/her person or exposes him/her to ridicule from doing any lawful act. By intimidating wrongfully restraining, wrongfully confining, or injuring him/her or by using criminal force on him/her or by holding out to him/her any threat of intimidating wrongful confinement, injury or the use of criminal force."

"Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in this institution. The institute shall take strict action including criminal proceeding and cancellation of admission against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging and the burden of proof shall hereby lie on the perpetrator of the alleged ragging and not on the victim. "An offence of Ragging may be charged either on a written complaint by the affected or on independent finding of the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009."

# Punishable elements constituents of Ragging

- Abetment/instigation to ragging
- · Criminal conspiracy to rag
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging
- · Public nuisance created during ragging
- Injury to body, causing hurt / mental trauma or grievous hurt
- Physical Extortion or Psychological humiliation
- Any act / abuse by spoken words, e-mails, snail mails, blogs, public insults etc
- Any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student

#### Punishments against Ragging:

- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits
- Forfeiting from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process
- Withholding of results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- · Cancellation of Admission.
- Rustication from the institution for a period, ranging from 1 to 3 years.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period.
- Fine of Rs. 25000/-.
- Collective Punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

The fresher/junior students are hereby instructed that they should move in groups within the academic areas/campus, should not respond to calls from seniors, should not participate in any kind of "fresher party" anywhere outside the campus, desist from doing anything against their will even if ordered by the seniors. They are hereby assured that they have nothing to fear as the institution cares for them and shall not tolerate any atrocities against them.



माननीय सर्वोच्च न्यायालय के आदेश दिनांक 27-11-06 संदर्भ एसएलपी 2495/06 केरल विश्वविद्यालय विरुद्ध प्राचार्यों की परिषद् तथा एसएलपी क्रमांक 24296/2004 डब्ल्यू पी (सीआरसी) नं. 173/2006 तथा एसएलपी क्रमांक 14356/2005 के अनुसार रैगिंग एक दण्डनीय अपराध है। महाविद्यालय या छात्रावास परिसर में या अन्यत्र कहीं भी रैगिंग लेना पूरी तरह प्रतिबंधित है। रैगिंग के लिए दोषी विद्यार्थी को महाविद्यालय से निष्कासित किया जायेगा व उसके विरुद्ध कठोर निषेधात्मक कार्यवाही की जाएगी। वरिष्ठ विद्यार्थी इसका ध्यान रखें।

दण्ड – मध्यप्रदेश विश्वविद्यालय अधिनियम १९७३ के अधीन बनाये गये अध्यादेश क्र. ७ की धारा १३ के अनुसार महाविद्यालय परिसर या बाहर अनुशासन भंग किये जाने पर दोषी विद्यार्थी के विरुद्ध निम्नानुसार दण्ड का प्रावधान है-

१. कक्षाओं से निलम्बन ।

- 2. महाविद्यालय से निष्कासन ।
- 3. विवि⁄स्वाशासी परीक्षा में सम्मिलित होने से रोकना ।

ैगिंग में संलिप्त विद्यार्थी के विरूद्ध कठोर दण्डात्मक कार्यवाही महाविद्यालय और छात्रावास से निष्कासन, छात्रवृत्ति तथा अन्य प्रदत्त लाभ वापस लेने की कार्यवाही के अलावा अर्थदण्ड और सार्वजनिक क्षमायाचना का भी प्रावधान रहेगा ।



- (a) Every student shall maintain the decorum of the College and be polite to the Principal, Vice-Principal, teachers, other staff and peers.
- (b) Every student shall totally concentrate on his/her studies and should actively participate in academic/non academic college functions.
- (c) Students are expected to maintain peace, harmony & cleanliness in he college. Admission shall be cancelled for those who cause damage to college property including building, library, laboratories, hostel etc.
- (d) Students shall not indulge in any political activity in the college campus. Violence of any kind shall not be tolerated.
- (e) If students have any difficulty that needs to be addressed they can put it through their representative in a disciplined and peaceful manner to the teacher, if very necessary to the principal. They can also contact their mentor teacher or the grievance redressal cell. However they cannot by any means contact any outsiders.
- (f) Students shall not be involve in any immoral / criminal activity. In case of any such involvement strict action shall be taken.
- (g) After admission if a student is found having submitted false documents / given false information / deliberately hidden important

- facts or if he/she has been admitted inadvertently then his/her admission can be terminated.
- (h) If a student leaves the college in mid session or is terminated mid session the student shall be refunded only the caution money. No other fees is refundable.
- (I) No student shall use his/her mobile phone in the class. If he/she is found doing so his/her phone shall be confiscated.

#### (नियमावली)

- (1) छात्र महाविद्यालय की शालीनता को बनाए रखे प्राचार्य, उप प्राचार्य, प्राध्यापकगण और कार्यालय अधिकारियों के साथ शिष्ट व्यवहार करें।
