Overall Assessment and Comments

Prior to the visit, the college submitted self-evaluative reports of each department which the audit team analyzed. The audit team visited the departments and interacted with faculty members. The academic and administrative audit report demonstrates the progressive trend of the college.

About the college

St. Aloysius' College, Jabalpur, is dedicated to maintaining its high academic standards. The college has updated its curriculum to align with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, focusing on skill development and hands-on learning. Faculty members are actively involved in research, publishing papers, and attending conferences. The college supports students with various programs, including scholarships and counseling. Beyond academics, the college excels in sports, NCC, NSS, and cultural events, winning many accolades. Additionally, the college is committed to social responsibility organizing various community service programs to help those in need.

- St. Aloysius' College has showcased a commendable commitment to academic excellence, as reflected in their impressive pass percentages across both undergraduate and postgraduate programs.
- The college's alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the revamping of the curriculum to fit the semester-based and annual implementation models is noteworthy.
- The emphasis on skill acquisition, vocational training, and the integration of elective courses in the academic programs is a forward-thinking approach.
- The establishment of a digital repository for seamless access to academic resources is a significant step towards modernizing the teaching-learning process.
- The college's dedication to faculty development, as evidenced by their participation in international conferences, research publications, and specialized training, is commendable.
- The institution's holistic approach to student development, encompassing academic, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities, is impressive.
- The college's endeavors in research, entrepreneurship, and social responsibilities highlight its commitment to innovation, community engagement, and societal impact.

Academic and Administrative Audit of Department of Botany and Microbiology

The Department of Botany and Microbiology offers a range of courses focusing on employability, entrepreneurship, and skill development, including Applied Botany, Basic Botany, and Industrial Botany for B.Sc., and Biomolecules, Bioenergetics, Microbial Metabolism, Medical Microbiology, and Bioprocess Engineering for M.Sc. Microbiology. The department conducts various student enrichment programs such as workshops, special lectures, and hands-on training sessions on topics like fungal identification, vegetative propagation, and ethics for botanists. Teaching and learning reforms include the introduction of the NEP syllabus with innovative practical projects and internships under the DBT Star Scheme. Value-added courses such as Water Quality Monitoring and Mushroom Cultivation further enhance student skills. The department has established functional MoUs with Narmada Gelatin Factory and Jawaharlal Krishi Vishwavidyalaya. Research grants and projects include a DST STUTI-funded project on Analytical Techniques amounting to INR 4.41 lakhs. Faculty members have published their research in journals indexed in Scopus and Web of Science. Although there are no consultancy services reported, faculty members have participated in national seminars and workshops, served on various committees at university and state levels, and reviewed for international journals. Faculty achievements include receiving prizes for research paper presentations. Students have also received awards in various competitions and projects. The department organized workshops and seminars, including a week-long workshop on Analytical Techniques, and maintains a wellequipped departmental library with relevant books and journals.

Teaching and learning reforms involve case studies, micro-teaching, literature review, and interdisciplinary activities. Value-added courses include Human Rights and Right to Information. A functional MoU with Jesus & Mary College, New Delhi, facilitates online guest lectures. The examination system includes a Semester system for B.A. I Sem, Annual system for B.A. II and III years, and CBCS for M.A. Faculty members have published in UGC Care List journals and served as reviewers for international journals. Awards for teachers include cash prizes from the National Human Rights Commission. Students have been recognized with certificates and cash prizes in various competitions. The department organized a national seminar on the National Education Policy 2020, funded by ICSSR, and maintains a departmental library well-equipped with relevant books and journals.

Teaching and learning reforms include the integration of ICT tools and experiential learning methods. The department offers value-added courses such as a Certificate Program in Export Import Management and Statistical Inferences and Research Methodology for M.A. students. The department maintains a strong focus on employability and skill development, preparing students for various competitive exams and higher studies.

Examination Cell Report

The Examination Cell at St. Aloysius College conducts a comprehensive audit of examination processes to ensure transparency, fairness, and adherence to best practices. The audit encompasses

all aspects of examination management, including planning, scheduling, question paper setting, conduct, evaluation, result publication, record-keeping, and continuous improvement measures. The staff profile includes a Controller of Examination, Deputy Controller of Examination, office assistants, and maintenance staff. The exam cell comprises are equipped with computers, printers, duplicators, Xerox machines, and examination software.

Statutory examination bodies involved include the Academic Council, Board of Studies, Exam Committee, Moderation Committee, Result Committee, Committee for Review of Answer Books, UFM Committee, and Degree Committee. The examination pattern varies across programs, with a semester system and grading system for undergraduate programs and a yearly marking system for postgraduate programs. Examination reforms include the implementation of a semester pattern for U.G. NEP and registration in NAD Digi Locker for uploading student mark sheets.

Key audit criteria include well-structured examination planning and scheduling, question paper setting and moderation by subject experts, strict confidentiality policies, robust examination conduct and security measures, standardized evaluation and grading systems, timely result publication and feedback mechanisms, grievance redressal and appeals processes, secure record-keeping and data security, and continuous improvement through feedback and internal audits.

Sports and Fitness Center Report

The Sports and Fitness Center at St. Aloysius College is managed by a dedicated Sports Officer and an Assistant Professor, supported by a sports committee. The infrastructure includes separate gym facilities for men and women, equipped with multi-gym stations, treadmills, cycles, twisters, dumbbells, barbells, and massagers. The center also features a basketball court, football ground, volleyball ground, handball court, table tennis hall, badminton hall, track and field facilities, and a kabaddi ground.

Students have achieved significant success in sports, with notable achievements such as Muskan Kirar winning a gold medal in the Taipei Archery Open Tournament and other students excelling in various national and international competitions. The college teams have also performed commendably in intercollegiate tournaments, reflecting the institution's commitment to promoting sports and physical fitness.

Library Report

The College Central Library at St. Aloysius College is staffed by a qualified librarian and an assistant librarian, supported by a library committee. The library boasts a collection of 84,648 volumes of books, 32,448 titles, 3,339 book bank books, 121 journals and magazines, 264,254 e-

books through resources like INFLIBNET and DELNET, 802 CDs and DVDs, 2,346 back volumes, and 17 newspapers.

The library services include new arrivals display, newspaper clipping, print journal service, orientation programs for students and staff, technical sessions, open access to the stack area, online public access catalog, automated library with bar-coding, digital library with 36 PCs, issue-return (circulation service), book bank for SC/ST and underprivileged students, scanning, printing, reprography, reference services, reading hall, Wi-Fi connectivity, and question paper services. Student satisfaction surveys indicate high overall satisfaction with library services, though recommendations for improvement include arranging fans in the stack area and providing separate seating for girls and boys.

It provides state-of-the-art facilities and resources for designing, prototyping, and testing new ideas and projects. The center offers various programs and workshops on design thinking, innovation management, and entrepreneurship, encouraging participants to develop innovative solutions to real-world problems.

The center has established collaborations with industry partners and research institutions to facilitate knowledge exchange and practical experience. It also supports student-led projects and startups through mentorship, funding, and access to advanced tools and technologies. The center's activities are aligned with the institution's mission to promote interdisciplinary learning and prepare students for future challenges in their professional careers.

Academic and Administrative Audit

St. Aloysius ' (Autonomous) College, Jabalpur, remains steadfast in its commitment to uphold its distinguished legacy of academic excellence. This commitment is manifested through the meticulous integration of quality -driven initiatives spanning curriculum design, innovative pedagogical practices, an enriched learning ecosystem, and rigorous assessment methodologies. The academic calendar commenced with the initiation of UG II and III year, along with PG III semester classes on July 11th, followed by the launch of UG I semester and PG I semester classes on August 1st. The academic rigor and dedication were reflected in the outstanding results announced in July. The Undergraduate programs, including B. A, B.Sc., B.C.A, B.B.A, B.Com, and B.Com (Hons.), reported impressive pass percentages of 98.75%, 90.02%, 95.83%, 96.24%, 98.15%, and 96% respectively . Similarly, the Postgraduate programs, encompassing M.A, M.Sc., and M.Com IV semester, achieved a commendable pass rate of 98.13%.

- Curricular Adaptations and Enhancements: In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the curriculum for the first and second semesters has been meticulously revamped to adhere to the semester-based implementation model. Concurrently, the second-year programs have been tailored to fit NEP 2020's annual implementation paradigm. Each academic program is enriched with a diverse array of elective courses, emphasizing skill acquisition and vocational training. Collaborative endeavors, as evidenced by numerous MoUs with organizations, bolster internship and project opportunities. The curriculum is intricately woven with multifaceted activities aimed at bolstering employability, fostering entrepreneurial spirit, and honing skills.
- Pedagogical Innovations and Assessment: The teaching-learning process is infused with skillcentric and hands-on experiential activities. A digital repository, housing learning materials and
 lecture videos, ensures seamless access to academic resources. The evaluation mechanisms have
 been refined in congruence with the directives of NEP 2020.
- Holistic Student Support Mechanisms: The institution prioritizes a conducive academic ambiance. Initiatives include bridge courses for seamless academic integration of newcomers, targeted remedial sessions, and enriched tasks for advanced learners. Personalized counseling ensures students' well-being, while the placement cell and research-focused central instrumentation center further their academic and career prospects. The Value-Added Center enhances linguistic, analytical, and presentation skills. Demonstrating commitment to inclusivity, 773 students were beneficiaries of state-sponsored scholarships, while an additional 163 students were supported through the Aloysius Student Aid Fund and 2 two are recipients of

international scholarships.

- Faculty Advancement Initiatives: This academic session, St. Aloysius College prioritized faculty development, with members attending 39 international and 45 national conferences, and presenting 45 research papers. Their scholarly output was commendable, with publications in Scopus Index, UGC Care List, and refereed journals, along with 65 book chapters. Fourteen Faculty Development Programmes were attended. 3 faculty members completed a certificate course on "Adaptive Design for Learning" at Ateneo SALT Institute, Philippines. Additionally, faculty undertook specialized training: a course on "Service-Learning in Asia" focusing on SDG 6, a fellowship at Sophia University, Tokyo, and a management training at Ateneo De Davao University, Philippines, reflecting the college's commitment to global academic excellence.
- Academic Seminars and Workshops: The institution consistently facilitates seminars and conferences to foster faculty development. In November 2022, the Botany Department held a weeklong workshop on Analytical Techniques, partnering with IIT Gandhinagar and funded by DST's STUTI scheme. The Zoology Department, in January 2023, conducted a workshop emphasizing 'Sericulture as Self-employment', collaborating with Madhya Pradesh's rural industries department. - Sports, NCC, NSS, and Cultural Excellence: St. Aloysius College has consistently showcased excellence not only academically but also in diverse arenas such as sports, NCC, NSS, and cultural activities. Falguni Ghansela's triumph in the National Level Youth Festival 2023 and Ishita Vishwakarma's Lata Mangeshkar Memorial Award are testaments to our students' unparalleled talents. In the NCC domain, five cadets marked their presence at the RDC Camp 2023, with Senior Cadet Captain Ishika Gurjar clinching the 3rd position in the All India Best Cadet Competition. Our sports representatives, including Muskan Kirar and Ragini Marko, have shone on international platforms, while others have made their mark in national competitions. Furthermore, our college teams have displayed commendable performances in intercollegiate tournaments. On the cultural front, our students have secured top positions in various university-organized events, reflecting the holistic development the college promotes.
- Co-Curricular Festivities: A spectrum of co-curricular fests was designed to foster diverse learning and engagement among students. "Vigyanam Garjana," initiated by the Biotechnology Department, sparked scientific curiosity. The Commerce Department insightfully navigated

through varied Indian business paradigms during the "Bharat Business Conclave." "Meraki," orchestrated by the Management and Computer Science Departments, offered a vibrant array of events, from "Quizzard" to "Snap My Life." Commemorating Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's 127th birth anniversary, an enlightening Intercollegiate Bharat Quiz was conducted. Furthermore, March 2023 witnessed the Computer Science Department championing technological innovation through the National Software Development Championship.

- College's Endeavors in Research and Entrepreneurship: Our College has been active in research, with faculty publishing several research papers and six notable books this year. The faculty members are recipient of major and minor research projects sponsored by ICSSR. To foster entrepreneurship, the institution held workshops on product development and business pitching the collaboration with MSME offered students insights into sustainable practices and available funding opportunities. This emphasis on innovation led to the creation of two startups, DropX Alliance and Booksreviewer.in, and the development of innovative products like a CPU cooling fan and a sugar-free alternative named INJIYA.
