• A talk on eye donation was organized at St. Aloysius College (Auto.), Jabalpur by the Women Cell on 27th August, from 8:15 am to 9:00 am. The gathering was addressed by Dr. Pawan Sthapak (Member of Indian Medical Association Madhya Pradesh, Jabalpur) and member of Dada Virendrapuriji Maharaj Netra Bank. The students were made aware about the conditions required for eye donation which is considered to be one of the noble acts after blood donation. He also informed the students that Dada Virendrapuriji Maharaj Netra Bank will be organizing Netradaan Jagrukta Rally on 1st September, 2019. The talk was attended by more than 180 students.



- The Women Cell of St. Aloysius' (Autonomous) College organized a lecture on "Nutritional Diet" on 21st Sep. 2019 for girl students. The speaker was Dr. Anjali Diwan, Jabalpur. In this lecture there were 178 students have participated.

corporate virtual body. She briefed the students about the common types of cybercrimes that are taking place. She added, since everyone has

easily become a victim of cybercrimes. She gave the students beneficial inputs as to how



to avoid and deal with such crimes. She also advised the students not to get terrified if such crime takes places rather approach the Cyber Crime branch so that proper action can be taken. The session was then opened for questions and queries, during which the students actively

participated. The number of students benefited by this talk was 144.





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
