5 AMAZING MEDICINAL GRASSLAND PLANTS

1. Yarrow

Achillea millefolium or Yarrow thrives are found in well-drained, especially hedgerows, meadows, waste ground, and waysides. It helps in treating Bites, burns, cold sores, eczema, gums and teeth, mouth ulcers, high blood pressure, wounds, colds, flu, nosebleed, chilblains, painful periods, chicken pox and shingles and varicose veins.

2. Fumitory

Fumaria officinalis or Fumitory is also called earth smoke because of the wispy, smoke-like appearance its foliage has as it grows. It is commonly found growing on grassy banks and in ditches, field margins and hedgerows. It can be used to treat Acne rosacea, acne vulgaris, boils, gallstones, and constipation.

4. Couch Grass

Agropyron repens or Couch grass grows on the edges of arable fields, meadows and on waste ground, and frequently invades the loose fertile soil of flowerbeds and vegetable patches in gardens. It is good for treating Gout, cystitis, kidney stones, and prostate problems.



3. Chamomile

Matricaria recutita/Chamaemelum nobile has scented flowers, and it grows in well-drained soil on waste ground and around field margins. It is good for treatment of bites and strings, restless leg syndrome, hayfever, insomnia, indigestion, fever, painful periods, hangover, and headache.



5. Agrimony

Agrimonia eupatoria or Agrimony, the name cocklebur comes from its clingy seeds that hook onto clothing or fur. It was traditionally used as medicine and as a dye plant, and is found growing in grass on sloping meadows and on waste ground. It can be used to treat Diarrhoea, diverticular disease, gallstones, and irritable bowel syndrome.
