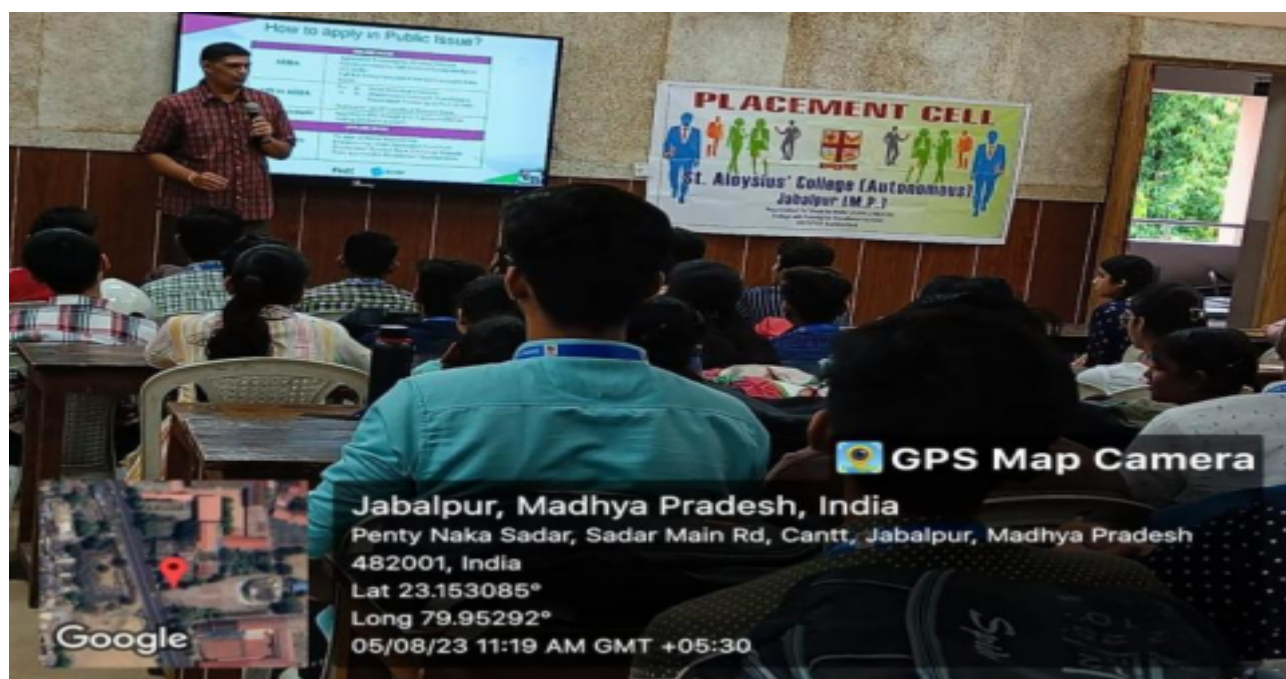
JULY 2023:

CAPITAL MARKET INVESTOR AWARENESS PROGRAM:

The Department of Management along with department of placement cell organized an enlightening guest lecture and workshop titled "Capital Market Investor Awareness Program" on August 5th, 2023, from 10:30 AM and 12:30 PM. The event aimed to empower students pursuing Management and Commerce courses with valuable insights into the world of capital markets and the risks and alternative opportunities involved. The number of participants were 75. The workshop was graced by the esteemed presence of Mr. Amogh Gothoskar, a seasoned professional with a PGDM in Finance & Marketing and more than 13 years of industry and training experience. Mr. Gothoskar's extensive background includes conducting over 400 Financial Literacy programs across various states, reaching out to marginalized groups and diverse audiences, including sex workers, public servants, students, and more. His expertise extends to being a trainer for government-funded Financial Literacy and Engineers' Employability courses, facilitated by the All India Council for Technical Education. As a resource person for commodities derivatives and investor awareness programs under the guidance of SEBI, NSE, and BSE, Mr. Gothoskar brings a wealth of knowledge to the table. His participation in investor education events and guest lectures at renowned B-Schools exemplifies his commitment to spreading financial literacy. The workshop revolved around elucidating the intricacies of financial markets, investment strategies, securities trading, and market operations. Collaboratively organized with the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) Investor Awareness Programme and SEBI, the event catered to the aspirations of budding investors. The core objective was to equip participants with the tools to make well-informed investment decisions, navigate market complexities, and comprehend the risks associated with investing.

Key takeaways from the workshop included:

Basics of Investing: Attendees received a comprehensive introduction to various investment vehicles, ranging from stocks and bonds to mutual funds and derivatives. Mr. Gothoskar effectively conveyed the potential returns and inherent risks linked to different investment options. **Risk Management:** The significance of risk management was a focal point, as participants gained insights into strategies for effective portfolio diversification. Understanding the impact of market volatility on investments was a cornerstone of this segment. **Market Regulations:** Mr. Gothoskar delved into the regulatory framework governing India's securities market. SEBI's role in maintaining transparency, fairness, and safeguarding investor interests was highlighted. **Investor Rights and Responsibilities:** The workshop emphasized the rights and responsibilities of investors, along with avenues for addressing grievances and disputes. **Avoiding Investment Frauds:** Attendees were equipped with the tools to identify and steer clear of common investment scams and fraudulent activities. **Market Analysis:** The workshop delved into both fundamental and technical analysis techniques, enabling participants to assess potential investment opportunities effectively. **Online Trading and Demat Accounts:** Attendees received comprehensive guidance on online trading and the process of opening Demat accounts. Efficient management of investments through online platforms was underscored.



WORKSHOP ON DE-ADDICTION FROM DRUGS

Nasha Mukht Kendra' Jabalpur organised an informative workshop on 'Drug-Free India' in ST. ALOYSIUS COLLEGE for BBA students on Thursday, August 10, 2023. The session focused on spreading awareness among students about drug addiction and its consequences on their health and life. The programme started at 12:30 pm with the welcome address by Ms Arshita Agrawal (BBA 3rd year). The resource person present were Mr Hemant Solanki (coordinator of 'Nasha Mukht Kendra'), Dr N.K Sarkar and Mr Neeraj Rajak (project director). There were 120 participants.

Opening remarks, introduction and briefing of the session were given by Mr Hemant Solanki. He shared that according to a recent survey, it was found that 299 districts in India have the highest number of young adults and adults who are addicted to drugs, 15 communities are from Madhya Pradesh. He highlighted a general problem in today's young generation. He mentioned that today's youth is very easy to influence and manipulate, hence making them an easy target for drug peddlers. He further explains how the youngsters are so quickly convinced and tricked into consuming intoxicants and without realising it becomes their addiction. He shared his personal experience from his work line about how a young talented boy somehow became stoned on consuming tobacco which eventually lead to cancer, to this day he regrets his doings and wishes to turn back time to improve himself. He asked the students to be responsible and rational citizens and to not get involved in the vicious cycle. He also asked the student to encourage other people to not consume any type of intoxicants, by explaining how it could result in fatal consequences. He is required to recommend them some remedies that can ease the urge to have drugs or withdrawal symptoms. Dr N.K Sarkar discussed the various drug variants and their side effects. He explained how inhalation and consumption of intoxicants lead to various health diseases like cancer, liver and anaerobic malfunction, drop in the haemoglobin level in our bodies, and also hallucinations and brain malfunctioning. He also shared some symbols to identify if a person is taking any kind of intoxicant or not. for eg:- someone consuming brown sugar would have brown stains on their thumb, index and middle finger. Someone using injection as the source of consumption would have black marks over his hands and so on. He explained to the student how catastrophic it can be to themselves and ruined their lives completely. He suggests counselling, rehabilitation centres and psychiatric treatment solutions to these problems. He informed the students to be serious about their lives, their goals and career and promote an 'anti-drug' environment, as these small measures will have a positive outcome for the country. He thanked the students and the faculty members and handed the mic to Mr Solanki for the concluding segment.



ACADEMIC AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES (AMA Academic Event):

I) Group Discussion:

On August 12, 2023, **Aloysius Management Association (AMA)** organised an academic activity/ event of Group Discussion. Topics for the group discussion were related to management, economy and social affairs where pupils from all the three years participated. The time duration of each discussion was 10 minutes. The participants were made aware of the rules and conditions a few minutes before the inauguration of the event. After a small introduction and briefings about the topic by one of the participants, the discussion started, all the students has original and opinions, some contended that Chinese goods are a hindrance to Indian economy and should be completely prohibited in the Indian market, some of them added by emphasizing the political relationship of India and China and people should refrain themselves from purchasing it's products. Others alluded to the lower price and good quality of chinese products, commenting on its good quality and sustainability and affordability and even corporates would go for a cheaper and better options in the market rather than spending extra.

Group- B: Topic- Impact of AI in today's job



The group discussion began with one of the participants explaining that even though AI have made our lives easier, it is a major threat to the jobs of many. It's an intimidating remark for a developing country like India where unemployment is a major problem and AI will worsen the situation, the jobs produced due to AI is very low as compared the jobs lost due to it. Other contestants argued that people have to update themselves with

Group- C: Topic – Is India ready to go digital?



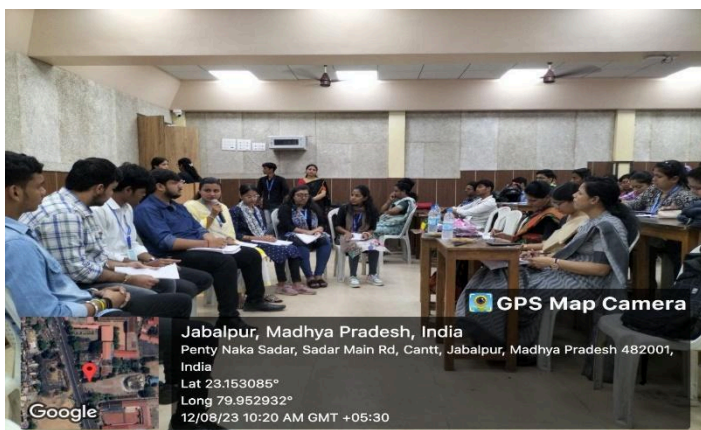

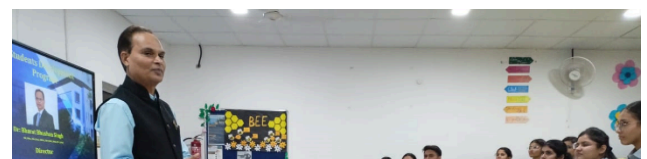
INDUSTRIAL CUM EDUCATIONAL TRIP TO PUNE INSTITUTE OF BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

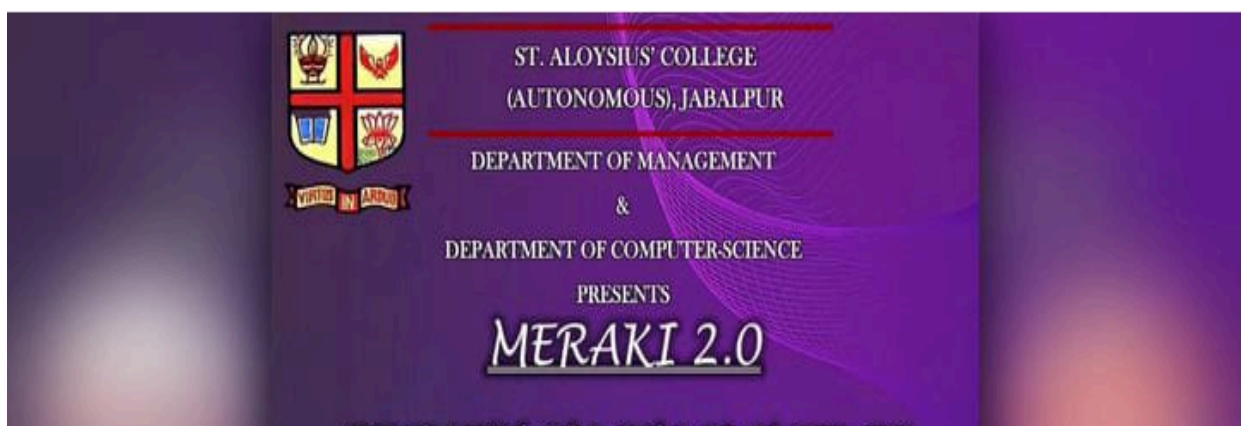
INDUSTRY VISIT (REVA KRIPA INDUSTRY SUGAR MILL)

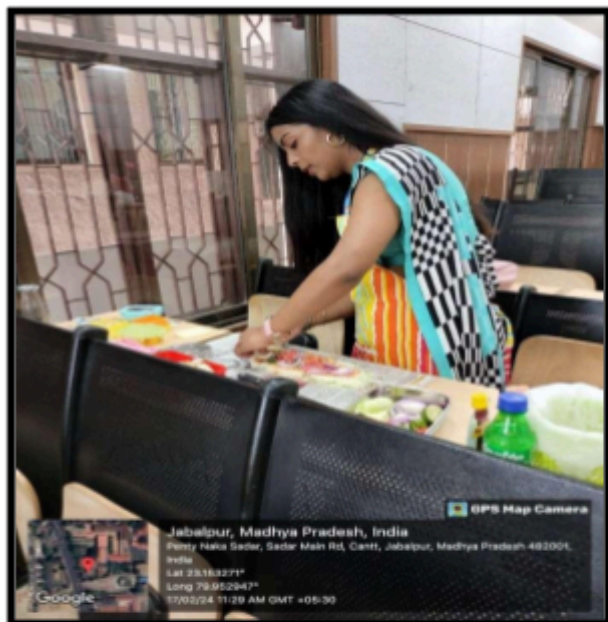


ACTIVITY. 9 FLAVOUR FUSION:

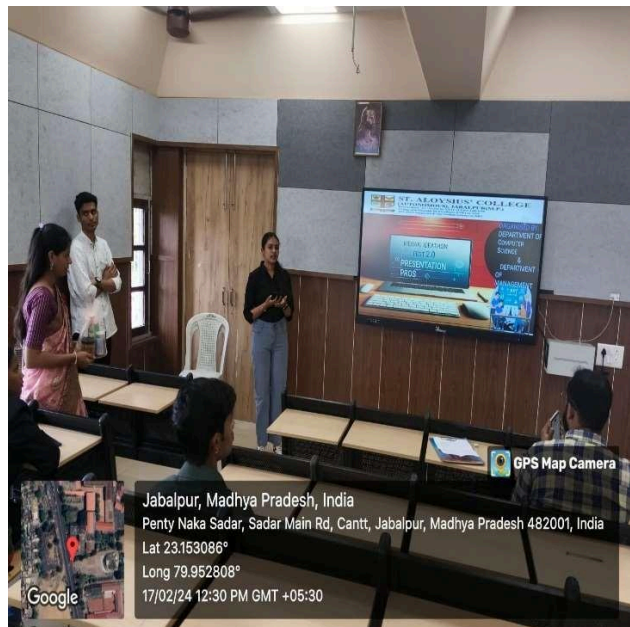
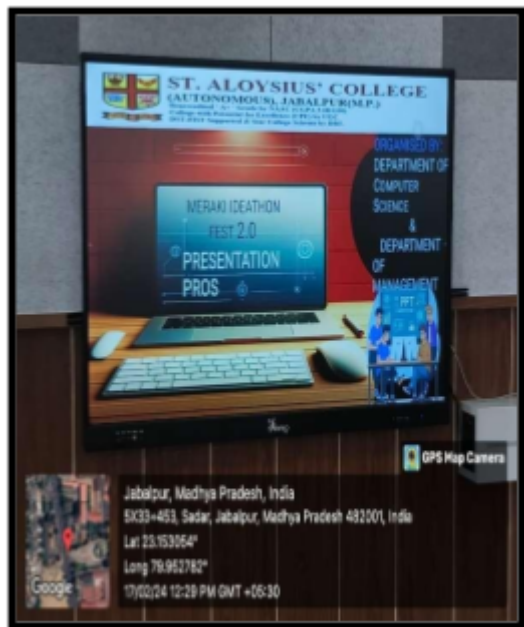

Managerial Skills are an Acquired Ability or an Inborn Quality ?

5 Tips for new Managers :

1. Develop great communication skills
2. Be collaborative
3. Keep growth mindset
4. Be confident and honest
5. Be empathetic

You must have a strong spirit if you want to be a successful person. The spirit factor is very influential in a person's success in starting a business, the greater the enthusiasm you have, the more opportunities for success will be opened. Even when you experience failure, you will have difficulty rising from that failure. On the other hand, if you have a strong spirit, no matter what the failure, you will get up and move on.

"Who you are is defined by what you're willing to struggle for." - Mark Manson.

If you want to be a manager and be good at it then you need to struggle, work hard for what you want to achieve.

Talent is a quality or ability that is inborn, rather than acquired. It can't be taught. However a skill is an ability that may be acquired by a person. Skills are generally unknown until learned and Managerialism is a skill and it can be acquired through dedication, education, practice and experience.

For example- We know that managers need to connect with and communicate to the team to **distribute the work**, and to **assign responsibilities**. A manager also has to **check** how the work is **progressing**; how people are **coping**; how well people are **inter-relating**. In addition there is a need for **motivating** the team... and **reporting** to the boss and the company. All these activities are founded on one's ability to communicate effectively.

However, communicating is not a one way street. It is not just about Speaking. It also includes the attributes of **LISTENING** and **UNDERSTANDING**. Managers who do not master the art of Listening and Understanding will fail as they do not complete the communication circle. Mastering this art comes from interaction and experience and is not something you are born with but rather you learn along and pick up with time.

- No one is a born actor, actress, doctor or engineer. Neither are managers. Managing is an art and it cannot be acquired overnight
- Management may be a very general term. However, each manager needs to excel in his

stream. Different forms of managerial skills are required for each stream. They need to be trained

- Management does not merely include managing people and work; it requires administrative techniques as well. These cannot be inbuilt.
- Management involves professionalism as well. This can certainly not be inbuilt. It needs to be taught.
- Even though managers may be born trained or not, professionalism, respect to others is what matters the most. If all of this is acquired, a manager will always excel.

People with a fixed mindset believe their intelligence or talents are simply fixed traits, and that talent alone creates success — without effort. Such people believe that managerial skills are an inborn quality. They're wrong. Successful people know this. There are also people who embrace problems as opportunities to learn, and see problems as interesting challenges. These people have a growth mindset, these people believe that new abilities can be developed through practice. They invest an immense amount of time on a daily basis to develop a growth mindset, acquire new knowledge, learn new skills and change their perception so that it can benefit their lives.

One doesn't really need to rely on their natural ability to get them to be a good manager. A good manager continues to work and develop their craft, they self evaluate, they adjust and improve as life goes on. Remember, who you are today, it's not who you have to be tomorrow.
