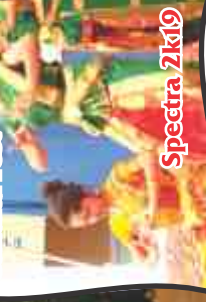

International Year of Basic Sciences for Sustainable Development

The importance of technological development and scientific research has never been felt more than now, as the pandemic takes over the globe. The global food system faces many complex challenges, including hunger, malnutrition and diet-related diseases, an ever-growing global population that needs sufficient and healthy food, the need to reduce food loss and waste, the depletion of natural resources, effects of climate change, and the effects of the current COVID-19 pandemic. Fish, molluscs, crustaceans and aquatic plants are fundamental, essential and indispensable foods eaten by people around the world. Small-scale artisanal fishers and fish farmers produce a large portion of this food. This year is an opportunity to highlight the importance of small-scale artisanal fisheries and aquaculture for our food systems, livelihoods, culture and the environment.



The Year of Glass

The development of modern science has been based on glass artifacts from the large scale (astronomy) to the small scale (biology); from simple lamps to the lenses for lighthouses; in communications and electronics ranging from the first valves to optical fibres. Now in a world constrained by a variety of environmental pressures, glass is one of the most recyclable materials; it has a variety of roles in reducing greenhouse gas emissions such as energy saving coatings, double/triple glazing and solar cells, it is made from widely available materials and is contributing to major improvements in our health. Thus this year is also an opportunity to highlight significance of glass in our society at large.

Principal's Report 2022-2023

St. Aloysius' College has been at the forefront of educating formation the young minds of the nation, strengthening their character and preparing them for facing any challenge as they progress ahead in life. The present year had been a year of both challenges and achievements. The College was awarded the Wheebox New Code of Education Award 2022 powered by Wheebox and technology partner Microsoft and Entrall Tech. Among the five categories, the college had been named the winner under Top Digital Enablers in the Autonomous College Category in the innovation of learning.

The College has been a premier institute and known to declare all academics results timely. After the outbreak of Covid-19, this year all UG & PG examinations were conducted via offline mode. A total of 1634 students appeared in Under Graduate and 264 in Post Graduate final year this session. In UG 1580 students graduated and 54 students had supplementary. In PG 264 students post graduated and 01 student had an ATKT.

In the session 2021-22 classes were conducted via online and offline mode. The classroom teaching-learning was resumed and great enthusiasm was witnessed in both the teachers and the taught. "Knowledge has to be improved, challenged and increased constantly or it vanishes" as remarked rightly by Peter Drucker. The College faculty is regularly contributing to research and publishing quality research papers. This year one patent was granted, 02 monographs were published, 03 books viz *Indra Bahadur Khareki Rachnao Mei Mulyabodh*, *Migrant Labour: Issues and Challenges*, and *Role of E-Resources and Mind Mastering Strategies in Education* were published. One Major Research Project is ongoing and 01 Minor Research Project was granted by the ICSSR. The faculty published 27 International and National research papers, 06 in Scopus Index, 03 in Web of Sciences & 07 in UGC Care List and 39 book chapters. Dr. Rupali Alhuwalia and Dr. Reeta Chouhan completed Harvard Bok Higher Education Teaching Certification, Mrs. Sukhvinder Walia, Dr. Rashmi Patras and Dr. Mary Raymer completed a Professional Certificate course on Adaptive Design for Learning sponsored by United Board for Christian Higher Education conducted by the School of Education and Learning Design, Alteneo Salt Institute, Philippines, and Ms. Bhawna Tekam received the Junior Research Fellowship in Political Science.

Under the DBT Star Scheme the Bio-Science departments organised educational tours and trips to Regional Science Centre, Bhopal, Rani Avanti Bai Sagar Hydroelectirc Power Plant, National Centre for Biological Sciences (TFIR) Pachmarhi, IISER, Bhopal and Industrial visit to Kareli Sugar Mill, Kareli.

The college regularly organizes seminars, conferences and workshop for the upskilling and improvement of faculty members. The Physical Sciences departments organised a collaborative International Conference on “Advances in Physical, Mathematical and Computational Sciences” on 23-24 July 2022. There were 198 participants. The Department of Economics organised an ICSSR sponsored Online National Conference on “New Educational Policy: Socio - Economic and Political Implication” on 30-31 July 2021. A total of 335 participants attended from different parts of the country.

The 3rd Online International Conference on “Advances in Physical, Mathematical and Computational Sciences” was organised by the departments of Mathematics, Physics and Computer Science on 24-25 June 2022. It was attended by 150 participants. A total of 33 papers were presented. The Department of Hindi organised a two days online E-seminar on “*Bhartiyata Ke Sajag Prehri Seth Govind Das*” on 28-29 June 2022. There were 85 participants and 20 papers were presented.

“Victories in life come through our ability to work around and over the obstacles that cross our path”. It gives me immense pleasure to share that this year our college students have brought international acclaim to the College. Muskan Kirar (B. A III) played World Championship September 2021, USA and won silver medal. She played World Cup Stage I, Antalya, Turkey, World Cup Stage II Shanghai, China and won Bronze Medal, selected for World Cup Stage III Paris, France and World Games Birmingham, USA. Mohammad Zaid Mansoori (B.Com Hons. I) participated in 1st International All Style Martial Arts February 2022 and won Silver Medal in Kumite Event.

In Khelo India University Archery Games 2022 under the category of mixed teams, Chirag Vidyarthi (B.Com I) and Muskan Kirar together won silver medal; Shivansh Awasthi (B.Com III), Aditya Upadhyay (B. A III) and Chirag Vidyarthi and won gold medal in compound category; Muskan Kirar won bronze medal in team event category. Seyad Faizan (B.Com II) participated in All India University Games 2022 and Khelo India University Archery Games. Aditi Shrivastava (B.Com II) participated at All India University Wushu Championship 2022 and in 19th Junior National Wushu championship in March 2021 and won two bronze medals and a Silver Medal in Kungfu Wing Chun Event.

Ashutosh Soni (B.Com III) participated in 30th Senior National Wushu Championship December 2021 and won Gold Medal in the Group Event. Ayush Kosta (B.Com I) participated at 14th Senior National Dodgeball Championship October 2021 and secured second Position. Mitali Yadav (B.B.A.I) participated in 4th Open National Taekwondo Championship December 2021 and won Silver Medal in -49 kg Weight category. Kartik Sharma (B.Com II) participated in 22nd Sub-Junior and Senior National Wushu Championship November 2021 and won Gold Medal in Nanquan Event. Yashika Sharma (B.Com III) participated in 31st National Strength. Lifting & Incline Bench Press Championship December 2021 won Gold Medal and broke the record of 150 kg weight of the year 2016 while lifting 155 kg weight in +80 weight category. Eighty students participated at district, at State level 53, at National level 22, at University level 34, at All India University level 19, at Khelo India University 05 and at International level 02.

The College teams participated in various Intercollegiate sports events and were winners in Volleyball (men), Table Tennis (women), Chess (men) and badminton (men). The college teams were runners up in Basketball (women), Kabbadi (men), Football (men), Cricket (men), Chess (women) and 2 Golds in Judo.

The students also excelled in co-curricular activities. Ishita Vishwakarma of B.A II year was 1st runners up in a National television competition India's Got Talent 2022. In NCC, SUO Anushri Shrivatsava represented MP & CG Directorate at RDC 2022 at New Delhi. She marched for the PM's Rally and was part of Rajpath Contingent too. Leading Cadet Ishika Gurjar was part of the prominent Pre -RDC 2022 held in Bhopal. Cadet Sanskar Satish Jain had a lifetime experience of visiting five countries viz Saudi Arabia, Oman, Egypt, Djibouti and Eritrea on board naval ships like INS Sujata, INS Tir, ICG Sharthi.

Honouring the “Swarnim Vijay Varsh” the glorious 75 years of India's independence, one of the victory flame lit by the Prime Minister of India arrived at the College and the NCC unit of the college had the incredible honour of receiving the glorious victory flame, incarnating exemplary valor and sacrifice of our resolute forces in safeguarding the nation.

“Giving back to society and community enriches our lives, making it a double blessing”, said Kellie Sullivan. The College organized programmes like health & hygiene, defence training programme for girl, vedic maths, sanitizer making workshop, awareness drive for crime & violence against women & cancer, training on website designing and martial arts, nukkad natika, plantation drive, Celebration of social justice day etc.

In this session, the Annual Social Gathering was conducted on the 23 December 2021 via a digital platform. It was an attempt to engage students in cultural activities during the pandemic and entertain them virtually. The entire gathering was streamed online.

The Annual Gold Medal ceremony was conducted on December 4, 2021. Chief Justice Sanjay Yadav, former Chief Justice High Court of Allahabad & an ex-student of the college was present as the Chief Guest along with Right Rev. Gerald Almeida, Bishop Catholic Diocese of Jabalpur as the Chairperson of the ceremony. Meritorious students were awarded gold medals in this auspicious ceremony. Forty Seven medals were awarded. Also, teachers who had completed 25 years of their services in the institute were presented token of appreciation for their dedicated services.

The Annual Prize distribution for co-curricular activities was conducted on March 29, 2022. Most Rev. Gerald Almeida presided as the Chairperson of the function along with the Principal. Certificates for extra-curricular, NCC and NSS were distributed to students for the session.

The college cultural teams participated in various Inter college youth competitions organised by the RDVV in which students excelled and brought laurels to the college. I am happy to share that the college won first position in mimicry, solo Indian light song, solo Indian classical dance and quiz. Our students also brought glory to the College at national and international singing competitions. Ishita Vishwakarma of BA II year participated in India's Got Talent Season 9 and was the first runner-up in the national competition.

This year the College witnessed three retirements of Dr. Elena Philip, Dean, Arts & Social Sciences, Dr. Shikha Bansal, former Head of the Department, Botany and Microbiology and Mrs. Bernadette, Support Staff. Dr. Elena Philip rendered her 27 long years of valuable services to the college and contributed significantly in many capacities to the institutional activities. Dr. Shikha Bansal retired after 10 years of dedicated services from college wherein she contributed actively to the field of flora and fauna. Mrs. Bernadette provided her active services for 31 years to the college as a support staff.

I am happy to share that I visited St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Mumbai from 19-20 January 2022 for NAAC Re -Accreditation as Member of the NAAC Peer team. The institute is able to achieve the unachievable only because students, parents, and teachers have faith in us. I would like conclude my report with the words of John F. Iwould like to share a few words before I begin- "F.A.I.L.- First Attempt in Learning." Around three years ago, it was the most important phase in my life. As a student, I think that I will always get opportunities as they are endless. This phase created someone new in me.

During my school life, I was a bright student not because I got marks, but I was teachers' favourite. I feel that because I and my sister were twins, we were always the centre of attention. Though I received average marks, I was good at grasping. I used to work hard since I had a reserved nature and was seen as a studious child. I remember calculating eight hours of study during my 12th quarterly exams.

Some readers would find it genuine to study this long, as I am a biology student. This was my perception at that time too, but this thinking made me more reserved and made me feel superior to others. Finally, my mind could not handle the stress and I experienced emotional turmoil. I managed to pass my 12th board exams but suffered its consequences. When I was in my first year of college when I failed exams. I had to gulp down my ego and accept the fact that I would have to repeat the year even after many requests. I felt hopeless, not only in myself but also in others. I had lost my confidence, and because of that incident in 12th grade, I could not concentrate either. It became a routine for me to not attend classes and keep crying, but I didn't realise that a miracle was waiting for me.

During my summer holidays, I was told about Brahma Kumaris. I started going to the centre and meditating daily. At the centre, there were pure vibrations. I also received a book which I read with interest; it had healing stories and I read a line that said, "First step to free your mind is to forgive. Try it by forgiving the one who, for instance, behaved abnormally with you, in front of all." I tried it

immediately and I felt stronger and noticed something lifted off my mind. This made my bond with the Brahma Kumaris stronger. One more change that I felt was that earlier I could not trust anyone, I almost felt everyone was monstrous to me, but I experienced myself shift from expectations to giving, and being cooperative, not competitive with others. All India Girls Trekking Expedition

Let me take you to the City of Unity, Ajmer through this article where the All India Girls Trekking Expedition took place. The All India Girls Trekking Expedition was held in November at Ghooghra in Ajmer, Rajasthan. The camp was successfully conducted by 11 RAJ BN NCC, Ajmer, under the NCC Group Headquarters, Udaipur and NCC Directorate, Rajasthan, from 17th till 24th November 2021. A total of forty NCC girl cadets with one ANO Lt. Monalisa Robert, and one PI Staff, Mr. Mandal, departed from Jabalpur to Ajmer on 16th November and reached 17th November 2021. Our excitement level went one step ahead after seeing the architecture of the station which was all built in a fortified manner. With a cap and tracksuit of MP & CG Directorate, the Jabalpur group marched ahead towards our base camp which was set up at Ghooghra, Ajmer. Our camp was organised for eight days, so let's start with day one. It was our Adam's day in which our documentation was done and we were assigned our rooms which became our second home with awesome fellow cadets from our state as well as from others. Our day ended up with us settling ourselves down in a positive milieu.

On the second day of our journey, after breakfast, we gathered for our welcome and opening address which was presented by the Camp Commander Colonel B.P. Fernandez of 11 Raj Bn NCC Ajmer, Rajasthan. He compassionately and humbly greeted and wished us for our successful expedition. In the evening fall-in, we were briefed about how we will be going for our trekking and educational tours. There, we got to know that a total of 510 girl cadets from four Directorates, namely Madhya Pradesh & Chattisgarh, Uttar Pradesh, Delhi and Rajasthan were present. The four Directorates were then divided into two teams, Team "A" comprising the cadets from Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan Directorates and Team "B" having its cadets from Delhi and Uttar Pradesh Directorates. We were informed that one day, Team A

would be going trekking in the morning, and on the same day, Team B would be going for an educational tour or Ajmer tour. The pattern would be vice-versa for the other days.

Moving on to the third day of our expedition, all trekkers were thrilled and excited for our first trekking expedition as we were in team A. After breakfast, our buses were ready outside to take us to the Nareli Hills. With the rhyme "Ek bar zoor se, NCC ki oor se" we boarded our respective buses and reached our destination, Nareli. There, we visited the famous Nareli Jain temple which is a complex of fourteen temples recently built and known for its architecture and intricate stone carvings. It gives it both a traditional and a contemporary look. Inside the temple, there was a statue of Lord Mahavira which was 24 feet in height. After the visit, our feet were ready to complete our trek on the Nareli Hills. After 5 km of walking, we reached the top, where twenty-three miniature temples were lined up and built beautifully on the hill above. We explored the area, and after some refreshments, we moved back to our base camp.

With black boots and heckles worn, we were ready to earn knowledge and experience. This line exactly defines our fourth day. We explored wonderful places as a part of our educational Ajmer tour. These places were Anasagar, Kala Bagh and Soni Ji Ki Nasiyan. Anasagar Lake was indeed a wonderful place where folk songs with colourful fountains were played for our NCC cadets, and everyone was overjoyed and was matching their steps to the rhythm.

Following this, we went to Kala Bagh, a beautiful garden which has a fountain, Charbagh, temple, toy train, children's play zone and open gym, yoga park and more. Moving ahead of our tour, we explored a divine place called Soni Ji Ki Nasiyan, which was indeed a mesmerising experience. It is an architecturally rich Jain temple built in the late nineteenth century, whose main chamber Swarna Nagari or "The City Of Gold," has a

prominent depiction of Ayodhya made from 1000kgs of gold. After an amazing tour, we all returned to our base camp while holding amusement and captivating experiences in our hearts.

The fifth day was the campfire day which happened earlier due to some reason. From Rajasthan's Ghumar to Delhi's representation of every state, and from Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh's 'Chilam Tambaku ka Dabba,' (which helped us to secure 1st position in the group dance competition) to Uttar Pradesh's sweet and soulful performance, all Directorates gracefully represented their culture and tradition with their utmost energy and talent. Our day ended with a DJ night that went on for an hour after the events.

On the sixth day of our camp, we had our second trek to Prithviraj Chauhan Smarak. The place of the mighty king Prithviraj Chauhan has a life-size statue of him mounted on a horse. We also got a glimpse of his fort from a distance.

Moving on to the seventh day, indeed a favourite and a memorable one for me and my co-cadets, was our shopping day at Pushkar. We were blessed enough to visit the famous Pushkar Lake and the 14th century Brahma Temple. After seeking the blessings from the

Education has been on the frontline of Covid-19. For almost two years, teachers around the world have been navigating education systems affected by structural closure, adapting and improvising to keep their students interested in learning. Remote learning without the internet is another challenge. It was just past the mowed bit where mum hung out the washing on the long clothesline which was held up with a wooden prop, and just before the long sticky grass. This little place was only big enough for you to go inside and sit on the seat that was a wooden box with a hole in it for your bottom.

Under this seat was a metal pan. In the back wall was a trap door where the dunny-man could get out the full pan and put in a clean one. Hammered into the wall was a nail. Hanging from this on a piece of string were square pieces of newspaper just big enough for you to wipe yourself on when you were finished. Under the paper was a smaller box full of sawdust for sprinkling with a little metal spade into the pan before you left. All this paper and sawdust in a small private place was a great temptation for my brothers, who were going through a "let's see what happens if we do this" phase.

On this particular day, things at home seemed too silent, and I went down the back stairs and out towards the long grass. Just then, the door of the dunny – another name for the lavatory – flew open, and my brothers burst out carrying with them the box of sawdust. They rushed round to the long grass and started to scoop the burning sawdust out with the little metal spade. Trouble was the grass then caught on fire. I grabbed an old hessian bag we used for carrying ice, and Peter ran off to see if he could get some powdered ice, which we could usually find under the electric saw that dad used to cut up the big slabs of frozen water.

By the time he got back Warren, and I had put the flames out, so we used the two handfuls of ice to cool our legs down where they had got singed by the fire. We hoped Dad wouldn't see the patch of burned grass, but he was usually too busy to go to that part of the yard.

We kids were the only ones who went through the paddock on our way to school. Just then, our nosy neighbour, Mr. Cantwell, looked over the fence. Besides him, three on either side were his tribe of sharp-nosed

kids. They all were small and had skinny faces and small eyes, and their clothes were all too small for them. This was strange because Mrs. Cantwell was one of the biggest women I had ever seen. She wore huge dresses with big bright flowers on them.

"I'll tell your dad what you kids have done," said Mr. Cantwell, and his kids all got smarty smiles on their faces. Suddenly, I got cranky. "Mind your own business," I shouted. I was surprised at how brave I was because kids in those days didn't talk back to adults. Then, I got nervous. I could feel the butterflies in my stomach.

That night at the tea-table we were all very quiet and I was scared. I was frightened that my very strict father would find out what we'd done and what I'd said. Somehow, he knew something was going on and later he took me aside.

Department of English

The English Department aims to strengthen the liberal education of students by developing a deepened understanding of language and literature, the value of critical reading and effective writing, and the richness of writing past, and present.

The highlights of the academic year 2021-22 are as follows:

Research, Publication and Consultancy- Departmental members are actively engaged in research and publication.

Dr. Neelanjana Pathak was invited to deliver a lecture as chairperson on "How to Read Shakespeare" and a lecture on "Valmiki Ramayana : a few questions" organised by iSPELL. She delivered a lecture as a resource person on Sandeshharika Women's Seminar, "Keeping Faith Alive: Struggles, Resilience & Victories of women in the face of COVID pandemic organised by Leonard Theological College, Jabalpur. Dr. Niharika Singh contributed three video lectures as E-content to Higher Education Bhopal. She also attended a two week FDP programme on "Development of Online Courses for SWAYAM." Dr. Niharika Singh and Dr. Soma Guha Das have attended Five Days FDP on Best Practices in Development of E-Content organised by Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of India. Dr. Mary Raymer successfully completed 'Adaptive Design Learning', an international professional certificate course conducted by United Board, sponsored by Ateneo University. She along with Dr. Niharika Singh has successfully completed a Refresher Course on English Literature.

A total number of five Research Papers were presented and Three Research Papers have been published, eighteen webinars, seven seminars and five Conferences, were attended by the members of the Department. - In this academic session on 30 October, 2021 the club visited "Nirashrisht Virdhashram, Medical College, Jabalpur" on the occasion of Diwali celebration. This was an opportunity where the students were able to provide time to the elders and were emotionally touched and blessed in their

presence. The club provided them with gifts, medicines, and essential items. Total Number of students participating were thirty five who had contributed the required essentials.

- With the changing dynamics of the digital environment, cyber bullying is one of the most sensitive issues people are facing in everyday life. To develop the awareness among students towards the various preventive measures and importance of Anti Bullying, a Slogan Writing Competition was organised on 22 February, 2022 on the topic “Anti Cyber Bullying” around twenty five students had participated in it. Ms. Surbhi Rajak stood first and

Ms. Niharika Nirankari stood second in this competition.

- On the occasion of "World Water Day", on 22 March, 2021, poster and collage competition on "Save Water" was held. This event was organised to embark the student with the sense of responsibility towards the conservation of natural resources and make them learn the importance of sustenance of water. The students enthusiastically participated and brought colours to their thoughts. Ms. Surbhi Rajak won the first prize in the poster competition and Ms. Ritu Pillai stood second.

Entrepreneurship Development Cell

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell, St. Aloysius College was started in the year 2019. It helps our students to acquire skills and necessary capabilities to play the role of an entrepreneur effectively. Our cell's basic motive is to promote the spirit of Entrepreneurship in the young minds of students and make them equipped to face the challenges which they would encounter in their Entrepreneurial journey.

- Three Days Programme “YESS - Young Entrepreneurs to Start-up Stars - A Beginning”** was conducted by ED cell in Collaboration with Jabalpur Incubation Center from 10-12 June 2021. More than a hundred students of U.G participated. The aim of YESS programme was to spread an awareness about innovation and Patenting.
- Business Idea Competition** - A virtual event in which participants were required to present their innovative business idea through a presentation held on 20 August, 2021. Nearly ten participants displayed their ideas.
- Corporate Interview Expo** - A virtual interview session in which participants were given a real time interview opportunity by an experienced professor Mr. Sagar Thakkar held on 31 August, 2021. Participants were marked out of ten according to their interview. Approximately, twenty participants gave interviews.

- Achievement** - On 29 October, 2021, Madras Christian College organised a case study competition. It was a moment of great pride for all of us that two of our students Pratham Naidu and Alfia Alvi of ED cell participated representing our college in Madras and won 1st prize in the competition. Fifteen teams participated in total.
- An offline event of Group Discussion was organised in the campus on 27 November, 2021.
- Corporate Talk Show** - A virtual lecture by Mr. Siddhant Dugar, ambassador at AIFMB, was organised. He delivered an inspirational and knowledgeable speech to our students on the topic 'Start up Business -Career in Business & Corporate World' on 02 December, 2021.
- Debate Competition** - It was an offline event held on 12 December, 2021 in which many teams participated.
- Corporate Business Expo** - A virtual event held on 14 December, 2021 in which participants had to choose one correct solution from the 4 given to solve the given case study related to business. The event was coordinated by Dr. Ashu Jain. Every participant was marked out of 10 for each question. Approximately, 20 students participated.
- Eureka Talk Show** - A virtual event was held on 17 December, 2021 in which Mr. Ankit Rajak delivered

a communication speech to all students. He shared many Google forms for recording our opinions and participants shared their opinions live. Approximately, ninety students joined and made the event successful. Students learned many new things and gained knowledge and they gave their valuable feedback for the event.

- **Extempore Competition** - This event was conducted in virtual mode on 18 December, 2021 in which every participant was given a topic and two minutes to speak on the spot.
- **Eureka Kids** - A virtual event was held on 18 December, 2021 in which 3 students Pratham Naidu, Alfia Alvi and Aisha Siddiqui gave an

interactive motivational talk on the topic “why entrepreneurship” to the school going students. Approximately, 150 school students joined and responded positively.

- **Quiz Competition** - A quiz was organised in offline mode on 21 December, 2021 in which various teams participated.
- ED cell in collaboration with Jabalpur Incubation Centre organised two days Entrepreneurship Boot Camp and Pitching Expo for college students on 3-4 January, 2022. More than 130 Students participated and more than forty five innovative ideas were presented. The Principal Rev. Dr. G. Vazan Arasu congratulated all the ideas along with participants for the successful event.

Sports Report

The highlights for the session 2021-22 are as follows:

- This year the inter collegiate tournament started with the Cycling Competition dated 21 November, 2021 in which four of our students participated and one student was selected for the All India University level.
- In December a number of sports events were organised. First was the Basketball (women) tournament from 2-4 December, 2021, our college team played the final against UTD RDVV but unfortunately lost and stood runners up. Four girls were selected for district, state and inter university level.
- From 4-6 December, 2021 volleyball (men) tournaments organised by UTD RDVV in which we stood winners. Six students were selected for district, state and inter university Level.
- From 8-10 December, 2021 Kabaddi (Men) tournament was organised by Shree Jankiraman College, thirty four teams participated. The college played the final against UTD RDVV and stood runners up. Two students were selected for district level and one for state and university level.

- From 9-11 December, 2021 badminton tournament was organised by Govt. Mahakuashal College Jabalpur and our team was the winner. Two students were selected for district, state, and inter university level.
- From 13-15 December, 2021 football (men) tournament was organised by UTD RDVV. Our team played the final against G S College and our college were runners up. Four students were selected for district, state university and as the football (men) team qualified this year in the west zone all four boys went for the All India University Tournament.
- From 13-15 December, 2021 Kabaddi (women) tournament, was organised by Shree Jankiraman College, thirty two teams participated, our college played the final against UTD RDVV and were runners up. Two students were selected at district level and one for university level tournament.
- From 16-17 December, 2021 was the table tennis (women) tournament organised by the Govt. Science College. Our girls team played in the final against the Govt. Science College and were the winners. Two were selected for district level and one for inter university level.

- From 23-24 December, 2021 Inter District Athletics Tournament was organised by UTD RDVV. The college team bagged two gold, five silver, and four bronze medals. Two of our boys were selected for the state and All India athletics tournament.
- On 24 December, 2021, there was an archery tournament in which we won four gold medals. Four students were selected for the All India University tournament where Muskan Kirar (B.A. III Year) won two gold medals and one silver medal, Shivansh Awasthy (B.Com. III Year) got one silver medal, Chirag Vidhyarthi (B.Com. I Year) got one silver medal, and Aditya Upadhyay (B.A. III Year) got one bronze medal and also got selected in Khelo India University Games 2022. There all the three boys won gold medals and Muskan Kirar won one silver medal.
- From 31 December, 2021 to 1 January, 2022 chess tournament was organised by Govt. College Barela where our men's team stood winner and women's

team stood runners up. Four boys and one girl were selected for the Inter University Tournament. The girls' team qualified in the West Zone this year and participated in the All India University Tournament and stood at seventh rank among all the fifteen qualified teams.

- In the month of January from 3-7 Inter Collegiate Cricket (men) tournament was organised by Govt. Science College. The college was runners up.
- On 28 January, 2022 Inter Collegiate Judo Competition was organised by UTD RDVV in which our college won two gold medals. Two boys were selected for the All India University Tournament and one was selected for Khelo India University Games 2022 among the two.

आज हमारे जीवन में मँहगाई बढ़ने का प्रमुख कारण माँग और पूर्ति के बीच अंसतुलन का होना है। जब हम किसी वस्तु की माँग करते हैं तो उस वस्तु की पूर्ति पूर्णतया नहीं हो पाती है। ऐसे में उस वस्तु की कीमत अपने आप दोगुनी हो जाती है। इससे सबकी अर्थव्यवस्था बिगड़ जाती है। क्योंकि लोग उन वस्तुओं की कालाबाजारी कर उसे कम कीमत पर खरीदते और दोगुनी कीमत पर बेच देते हैं। सबसे ज्यादा मँहगाई बढ़ने के कारण प्रकृति का प्रकोप जैसे बाढ़, सूखा, अतिवृष्टि, भूकंप आदि है। यह सब मँहगाई को बढ़ाने में सहायक होते हैं। उन सबकी वजह से खेती की ऊपज बहुत घट जाती है और जो भी खाद्यान्न व अन्य वस्तुएँ है, उन सबको बहुत ज्यादा कीमत पर बाहर से मँगवाना पड़ता है। जमाखोरी, कालाबाजारी आदि मानव निर्मित कारण हैं। इसके अलावा दोषपूर्ण वितरण प्रणाली, असफल सरकारी नियंत्रण तथा मनुष्य की स्वार्थपूर्ण प्रवृत्ति भी इसके लिए उत्तरदायी है।

मँहगाई का सही अर्थ होता है वस्तुओं की कीमत का ज्यादा होना। मँहगाई की वजह से हमारे देश की अर्थव्यवस्था में बहुत बार उतार—चढ़ाव देखने को मिले। मँहगाई ने ही मनुष्य के जीवन की आजीविका को भी प्रभावित किया है। आज

तक हमारे समाज में मँहगाई और मुद्रा—स्फीति बहुत ही बड़ी समस्या है। हमारी जरूरत की सभी बस्तुएँ बहुत मँहगी आती हैं और कभी —कभी तो बस्तुएँ बाजार से ही गायब हो जाती हैं। लोग अपनी तन्खा में सरकार से जब वृद्धि की माँग करते हैं तो सरकार के पास इसका कोई जवाब नहीं होता क्योंकि देश के पास धन नहीं है। सिक्के की कीमत घट जाती है और मँहगाई बढ़ती जाती है।

मँहगाई के कारण :—

मँहगाई के बढ़ने के बहुत कारण होते हैं। मँहगाई की समस्या हमारे ही नहीं बल्कि पूरे विश्व की एक बहुत ही गंभीर समस्या है जो लगातार बढ़ती जा रही है।

जनसंख्या वृद्धि :— हमारे देश में जिस तरह से जनसंख्या बढ़ रही है, उस तरह से फसलों की पैदावार यहाँ नहीं हो रही है। पिछले 2—3 सालों से फसलों में अधिक वृद्धि हो रही है। देश में अतिवृष्टि और अनावृष्टि दोनों की वजह से ही अन्न की कमी हो रही है। इसीलिए जनसंख्या वृद्धि के कारण मँहगाई से लोगों को बहुत मार झेलनी पड़ रही है।

जमाखोरी की समस्या :— जमाखोरी से भी मँहगाई की समस्या बहुत बढ़ती जा रही है। कालाबाजारी की वजह से लोगों को खाने के लिए अन्न भी नहीं मिल पाता है।

कौन —कौन जिम्मेदार है:— बढ़ती हुई मँहगाई के लिए सबसे ज्यादा अमीर लोग जिम्मेदार होते हैं। क्योंकि वह बाजार से बहुत कम कीमतों पर समान खरीद लेते हैं। फिर बाद में उनको समय आने पर अधिक मूल्य पर मार्केट में बेच देते हैं। इससे उनके फायदे के लिए आम जनता को बहुत नुकसान उठाना पड़ता है। इसके अलावा सरकारी अफसर, नेता बड़े—बड़े उद्योगपति ये सभी मँहगाई को बढ़ाने के लिए जिम्मेदार होते हैं।

मँहगाई को रोकने के उपाय :— अगर कोशिश की जाये तो भारत में मँहगाई को रोका जा सकता है। इसके लिए सबसे पहले सरकार को मुद्रा —स्फीति पर रोक लगानी होगी और बेवजह घाटों को बनाना बंद करना होगा मँहगाई को रोकने के उपाय निम्न हैं।

सरकार को बड़े —बड़े नगरों के विकास के साथ गाँवों में विकास पर अधिक ध्यान देना चाहिए। क्योंकि अब लोग गाँव में सुविधाएँ ना होने के कारण ज्यादातर लोग शहरों की तरफ भाग रहे हैं। क्योंकि न गाँव में पानी की व्यवस्था है ना बिजली की व्यवस्था और जीवन के मूलभूत संसाधनों की भी बहुत कमी है। इसी वजह से सरकार को गाँव की तरफ विशेष ध्यान देना चाहिए पूरे देश के लिए एक तरह की सिंचाई व्यवस्था का आयोजन होना चाहिए। मँहगाई को रोकने के लिए समय —समय पर हड़तालें और आंदोलन चलाये गये हैं।

तब वो समय था जब मोबाइल फोन का इस्तेमाल कम शुरू हुआ था। मेरा सबसे खास और प्रिय विद्यार्थी मेरे बाबा (दादा जी) थे। वे एक बहुत ही अच्छे और सबसे उत्साहित विद्यार्थी थे। वे मेरे से सीखते मेरे विद्यालय जाते पर उसका स्वयं अभ्यास करते और मेरा इंतजार करते। यदि वे बिना गड़बड़ किये अपना अभ्यास पूरा कर लेते तो बेहद खुश होते और मैं उनको 5 स्टार देती। और यदि कोई गड़बड़ हो जाती तो वे अपने बहुत प्यारी सी संकोची मुस्कान के साथ कहते, गुड़िया देखो तो क्या कर दिया मैंने। वो मुस्कान मुझे आज भी बहुत अच्छे से याद है।

जब वे बिना मेरी मदद के कार्य करते तब उनका चेहरा देखने जैसा होता बहुत सारी खुशी से भरपूर और उत्साहित मुझे बताने के लिए। हाँ, कभी—कभी वे एक ही चीज बार—बार पूछ कर मुझे गुस्सा जरूर दिला दिया करते थे, क्या एक बच्ची थी जब।

ग्लोबल वॉर्मिंग एक बड़ा पर्यावरणीय मुद्दा है जिसकी वजह से पूरा विश्व बड़ी चुनौती का सामना कर रहा है। ग्लोबल वॉर्मिंग की बढ़ोत्तरी में न केवल प्राकृतिक तत्व जिम्मेदार हैं, बल्कि इनमें मानवीय गतिविधियाँ भी जिम्मेदार हैं। प्राकृतिक कारणों में ग्रीनहाउस गैसों की रिहाई शामिल है जो पृथ्वी से भागने में सक्षम नहीं है जिससे तापमान में वृद्धि होती है।

ग्लोबल वॉर्मिंग धरती के वातावरण को नकारात्मक रूप से प्रभावित कर रही है। ग्लोबल वॉर्मिंग का प्रभाव निरंतर बढ़ता जा रहा है। ग्लोबल वॉर्मिंग या वैश्विक तापमान बढ़ने का मतलब है कि धरती की सतह के तापमान में लगातार बढ़ोत्तरी। वैज्ञानिकों के शोध के अनुसार आने वाले दिनों में धरती में ऐसे परिवर्तन आएंगे जो न केवल प्रकृति को प्रभावित करेंगे बल्कि मानवीय जीवन शैली को भी नकारात्मक रूप से प्रभावित करेंगे।

धरती की सतह के तापमान में बढ़ोत्तरी की वजह से मौसम का मिजाज बुरी तरह से बिगड़ा हुआ दिखेगा। इस परिवर्तन के पीछे ग्रीन हाउस गैसों की मुख्य भूमिका है जिन्हें सी एफ सी या क्लोरोफ्लोरोकार्बन भी कहते हैं। इनमें कार्बन डाइऑक्साइड, मीथेन, नाइट्रस ऑक्साइड और वाष्प है। वैज्ञानिकों का कहना है कि ये गैसें वातावरण में बढ़ती जा रही हैं। और इससे ओजोन परत की छेद का दायरा भी बढ़ता जा रहा है।

ग्लोबल वॉर्मिंग मनुष्यता के लिए खतरा साबित हो सकता है। मनुष्य हमेशा अपनी सुख सुविधा के लिए पर्यावरण में इतने परिवर्तन किए, तरह—तरह की गैसों से वायुमंडल को असंतुलित किया कि आज ग्लोबल वॉर्मिंग के रूप में एक भयानक चुनौती पूरी दुनिया के सामने खड़ी है।

शिक्षक किसी भी राष्ट्र के सर्वांगीण विकास का सशक्त माध्यम है, सार्थक शिक्षा ही मनुष्य के जीवन को सफल बनाती है। व समाज में राष्ट्र की प्रत्येक समस्याओं का समाधान खोजने में सक्षम है। अतः शिक्षा को व्यावहारिक रूप में सार्थकता प्रदान करने के लिए नवीन शिक्षा नीति का गठन किया गया। इस नीति के द्वारा भारत के शिक्षा जगत् के इतिहास में सबसे बड़ा बदलाव किया गया है।

मानव संसाधन एवं विकास मंत्रालय के द्वारा नई शिक्षा नीति पेश की गई है। भारत की यह शिक्षा नीति इसरो प्रमुख डॉ. कस्तूरी रंजन की अध्यक्षता में की गई है। शिक्षा नीति में बदलाव कुल 34 वर्ष के अंतराल के बाद किया गया है। बदलाव जरूरी है और समय की जरूरत के अनुसार यह पहले ही हो जाना था।

RTE के तहत समस्त छात्रों को लाभ मिले इसके लिए गरीबी स्तर के बच्चों के भविष्य पर प्रकाश डाला जाना चाहिए।

छत्रपति शिवाजी महाराज एक बहादुर, बुद्धिमान, शौर्यवीर और दयालु शासक थे। उनका जन्म 19 फरवरी 1627 को मराठा परिवार में महाराष्ट्र के शिवनेरी में हुआ। शिवाजी के पिता शाहजी और माता जीजाबाई थीं। माता जीजाबाई धार्मिक स्वाभाव वाली होते हुए भी गुण—स्वाभाव और व्यवहार में वीरांगना नारी थीं।

शिवाजी का पराक्रम :— युवावस्था में आते ही उनका खेल शत्रुओं पर आक्रमण कर उनके किले आदि को जीतना हो गया। जैसे ही शिवाजी ने पुरंदर और तोरण जैसे किलों पर अपना अधिकार जमाया वैसे ही उनके नाम और कर्म की सारे दक्षिण में धूम मच गई। यह खबर आग की तरह आगरा और दिल्ली तक जा पहुँची। अत्याचारी किस्म के युवा और उनके सहायक सभी शासक उनका नाम सुनकर ही मारे डर के बगलें झाँकने लगे।

छत्रपति शिवाजी महाराज एक भारतीय शासक थे जिन्होंने मराठा साम्राज्य खड़ा किया था इसीलिए उन्हें एक अग्रगण्य वीर एवं अमर स्वतंत्रता सेनानी स्वीकार किया जाता है।

वीर शिवाजी राष्ट्रीयता के जीवंत प्रतीक एवं परिचायक थे। इसी कारण निकट अतीत के राष्ट्रपुरुषों में महाराणा प्रताप के साथ—साथ इनकी भी गणना की जाती है।

बहुमुखी प्रतिभा के धनी छत्रपति शिवाजी महाराज की जयंती महाराष्ट्र में वैसे तो 19 फरवरी को मनाई जाती है। लेकिन कई संगठन शिवाजी का जन्मदिवस हिन्दू कैलेंडर में आने वाली तिथि के अनुसार मनाते हैं। उनकी इस वीरता के कारण ही उन्हें एक आदर्श एवं महान राष्ट्रपुरुष के रूप में स्वीकारा जाता है। छत्रपति शिवाजी महाराज का 3 अप्रैल 1680 ई. में तीन सप्ताह की बीमारी के बाद रायगढ़ में स्वर्गवास हो गया।

उपसंहार — यूं तो शिवाजी पर मुस्लिम विरोधी होने का दोषारोपण किया जाता है। पर यह सत्य इसलिए नहीं है कि क्योंकि उनकी सेना में तो अनेक मुस्लिम नायक एवं सेनानी थे तथा अनेक मुस्लिम सरदार और सूबेदारों जैसे लोग भी थे। वास्तव में शिवाजी का सारा संघर्ष उस कटुता और उद्दंडता के विरुद्ध था, जिसे औरंगजेब जैसे शासकों और उसकी छत्रछाया में पलने वाले लोगों ने अपना रखा था।

लड़कियों पर अत्याचार

बेहतर पर्यावरण एवं स्वास्थ्य के लिए तेल बचाव

ध्वनि प्रदूषण एवं जन जागृति

ध्वनि वह तत्व है, जिसका आभास हमारी कर्णेन्द्रियों से होता है। किसी वस्तु के कंपन से ध्वनि उत्पन्न होती है ध्वनि की अवांछनीय तीव्रता को शोर कहते हैं। संयुक्त राष्ट्र संघ ने 1972 में असहनीय ध्वनि को प्रदूषण का अंग ही माना है। तीव्र गति से बढ़ती जनसंख्या एक गंभीर समस्या के रूप में उभरी है और इसका कुप्रभाव मनुष्यों के ऊपर ही नहीं बल्कि पशु-पक्षियों एवं वनस्पतियों पर भी पड़ता है।

ध्वनि प्रदूषण के स्रोत

- 1. प्राकृतिक स्रोत :-** प्राकृतिक क्रियाओं के फलस्वरूप भी ध्वनि प्रदूषण होता है। इसके अंतर्गत बादलों की गड़गड़ाहट बिजली की कड़क तूफानी हवाओं आदि से मनुष्य असहाय महसूस करता है।
- 2. मानवीय स्रोत :-** बढ़ते हुए शहरीकरण, परिवहन, खनन के कारण शोर की समस्या गंभीर रूप लेती जा रही है। वस्तुतः शोर और मानवीय सभ्यता सदैव साथ रहेंगे।

उद्योग :- लगभग सभी औद्योगिक क्षेत्र ध्वनि प्रदूषण से प्रभावित हैं। कल कारखानों में चलने वाली मशीनों से उत्पन्न आवाज़, गड़गड़ाहट इसका प्रमुख कारण है। ताप विद्युत गृहों में लगे ब्यायलर टरबाइन काफी शोर उत्पन्न करते हैं। अधिकतर उद्योग शहरी क्षेत्रों में स्थापित है अतः वहाँ ध्वनि प्रदूषण की तीव्रता अधिक है।

परिवहन के साधन — ध्वनि प्रदूषण का एक प्रमुख कारण परिवहन के विभिन्न साधन भी है। परिवहन के सभी साधन कम या अधिक मात्रा में ध्वनि उत्पन्न करते हैं। इनसे होने वाला प्रदूषण बहुत अधिक क्षेत्र में होता है।

मनोरंजन के साधन :- मनुष्य अपने मनोरंजन के लिए विभिन्न साधनों का उपयोग करता है। वह टी.वी. रेडियो, टेपरेकार्डर, म्यूजिक सिस्टम जैसे साधनों द्वारा अपना मनोरंजन करता है। परंतु इससे उत्पन्न तीव्र ध्वनि शोर का कारण बन जाती है।

निर्माण कार्य :- विभिन्न निर्माण कार्यों में प्रयुक्त विभिन्न मशीनों और औजारों के प्रयोग के फलस्वरूप ध्वनि प्रदूषण बढ़ता है।

आतिशबाजी :- हमारे देश में विभिन्न अवसरों पर की जाने वाली आतिशबाजी भी ध्वनि प्रदूषण का मुख्य स्रोत है। विभिन्न त्यौहारों, उत्सवों, मेलों, सांस्कृतिक वैवाहिक समारोहों में आतिशबाजी एक आम बात है। इन आतिशबाजी से वायु प्रदूषण तो होता ही है साथ ही ध्वनि तंरगों की तीव्रता भी इतनी अधिक होती है, जो ध्वनि प्रदूषण जैसी समस्या को जन्म देती है।

पर्यावरण संरक्षण आज के समय की एक महत्वपूर्ण आवश्यकता और हम सबकी नैतिक जिम्मेदारी है। यदि हम स्वयं पर्यावरण संरक्षण के प्रति जागरूक होंगे तो यही हमारी राष्ट्र और समाज के प्रति सच्ची सेवा कहलाएगी। तब हम सच्चे राष्ट्र और देशभक्त का निर्माण कर एक नये युग का आह्वान कर सकने में सफल होंगे क्योंकि शुद्ध पर्यावरण में ही शुद्ध वायु और शुद्ध मानसिकता का जन्म संभव है।

आजकल देखा जा रहा है कि जरा सा किसी प्रसन्नता का मौका आता है कि लोग इतने खुश हो जाते हैं कि काफी देर तक पटाखे जलाते, बँड-बाजा बजाते हैं या घरों में धार्मिक अवसरों पर आतिशबाजी करते हैं या घरों में जागरण करते हैं।, लेकिन हम यह भूल जाते हैं। कि हमारे आस-पास कुछ बूढ़े-बच्चे तथा हृदय रोगी भी रहते हैं जिनको तेज आवाज शोर-शराबे से परेशानियाँ होती हैं। यही ध्वनि प्रदूषण से उनको काफी नुकसान पहुँचता है तो हमें इससे जागरूक होना चाहिए। बिना शोर के भी उत्साह मनाया जा सकता है।

ऑनलाइन लर्निंग :- कोविड 19 के समय में रामबाण

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यह कथन कोविड 19 के समय में ऑनलाइन लर्निंग के विषय में उपयुक्त बैठता है। अगर कोविड 19 के दौरान सभी सरकारी संस्थान स्कूल, कॉलेज, सरकारी संस्थान बंद न होते तो ऑनलाइन लर्निंग प्रणाली की शुरुआत न होती। इस कथन से तात्पर्य यह नहीं है कि कोविड 19 लॉकडाउन लगना आवश्यक था। अपितु इस कथन से आशय है कि ऑनलाइन लर्निंग के द्वारा बच्चों को बहुत सी नई जानकारीयाँ प्राप्त हुई है। अगर ऑनलाइन लर्निंग का विकल्प हमारे सामने न होता तो हमारे देश में बच्चे शिक्षा से विमुख हो जाते, वंचित रह जाते हैं। जैसा कि हमारे निबंध के विषय से ही भलीभाँति प्रस्तुत होता है कि कोविड 19 के समय में ऑनलाइन लर्निंग रामबाण का कार्य कर रही है अर्थात् बच्चों की शिक्षा के लिए सबसे उपयुक्त समाधान है।

ऑनलाइन लर्निंग की परिभाषा :- हमारी परंपरागत शिक्षा के अनुसार विद्यालय की एक कक्षा में शिक्षक व बच्चे दोनों ही बैठे होते थे और श्यामपट में शिक्षक बच्चों को चॉक से पढ़ाते थे। ऑनलाइन लर्निंग में इसके बिल्कुल विपरीत शिक्षक अपने घरों में बैठकर मोबाईल, लेपटॉप, कम्प्यूटर के द्वारा जूम, गूगल मीट, टेलीग्राम आदि एप्स के माध्यम से बच्चों को पढ़ाते हैं। और बच्चे अपने घरों में ही बैठकर शिक्षा ग्रहण करते हैं। और अगर बच्चो को किसी विषय में कुछ दिक्कत आती है तो वह विषय संबंधित शिक्षक से इसके लिए अपनी समस्या का समाधान पा सकता है।

ऑनलाइन लर्निंग के लाभ :- ऑनलाइन लर्निंग के बहुसंख्यक लाभ निम्नानुसार है—

1. यातायात और समय की बचत की सुविधा — ऑनलाइन लर्निंग में शिक्षक और बच्चों को एक जगह से दूसरी जगह की यात्रा नहीं करनी पड़ती । शिक्षक और बच्चे अपने ही घरों में बैठकर शिक्षा देते और लेते हैं। इससे यातायात में होने वाले खर्च और समय की बचत होती है।
2. चलचित्र के द्वारा विषय को आकर्षक बनाना — ऑनलाइन लर्निंग में बच्चों को कम्प्यूटर स्क्रीन या मोबाइल स्क्रीन के माध्यक से चित्र व वीडियो दिखाकर संबंधित विषय को पढ़ाया जाता है। जिससे उनकी रुचि बढ़ती है और उनका उस विषय की ओर रुझान भी बढ़ता है। क्योंकि जो हम आँखों से देखते हैं वह हमारे मस्तिष्क पर गहरा प्रभाव डालता है।
3. कम खर्च में पढ़ाई — इस प्रणाली के तहत हमें कोचिंग के लिए जैसे परीक्षा संबंधित कोचिंग नीट, बैंक, सिविल सर्विस आदि के लिए घर बैठे कोचिंग की फीस देनी होती है और हमारे आने-जाने रहने के खर्च से मुक्ति मिल जाती है । और यह लाभ सभी वर्ग के लोग उठा सकते हैं। क्योंकि हमारे समाज में निम्न वेतन वर्ग के लोग इतना अधिक खर्च वहन नहीं कर सकते हैं और कई हुनर मंद लोग पीछे रह जाते हैं।

ऑनलाइन तकनीकी की जानकारी — इसके तहत बच्चे मोबाइल लैपटॉप का प्रयोग करते हैं और बच्चों को इनकी नई-नई जानकारी जानने को मिलती है जो आगे उनके भविष्य में उनकी नौकरियों में कारगर साबित होगी क्योंकि आज का युग कम्प्यूटर का युग है सारे काम कम्प्यूटर की प्रणाली के द्वारा होते हैं और यह बच्चे शुरू से सीखेंगे तो बच्चे इसमें परिपूर्ण हो जायेंगे।

उपसंहार — हमारे प्रधानमंत्री नरेन्द्र मोदी ने भारत को टेक्नो फ्रेंडली बनाने की ओर बहुत सी योजनाएँ शुरू की है और ऑनलाइन लर्निंग इसका एक महत्वपूर्ण स्तंभ है। इससे ऑनलाइन शिक्षा कोविड 19 के दौरान सबसे बड़ा रामवाण साबित होती है।

भारत भूमि :— भारत भूमि की महानता उसकी विशाल जनसंख्या अथवा भू-क्षेत्र के कारण नहीं, अपितु उसकी भव्य और अनुकरणीय उदार परम्पराओं के कारण रही है। आचार—विचार, चिंतन, भाषा और वेशभूषा की विविधताओं को राष्ट्रीयता के सूत्र में पिरोकर भारत ने मानवीय एकता का आदर्श उपस्थित किया है।

धर्म के तत्व :— भारतीय मान्यता के अनुसार धैर्य, क्षमा, आत्मसंयम, चोरी न करना, पवित्र भावना, इन्द्रियों पर नियंत्रण बुद्धिमता, विद्या, सत्य और क्रोध न करना ये धर्म के दस लक्षण हैं।

सभी धर्म इनको अपना आदर्श और अपना अंग मानते हैं। महाभारत में कहा गया है कि जो सब धर्मों को सम्मान नहीं देता, वह धर्म नहीं अधर्म है। मनुष्य को मनुष्य का गला काटने की दुष्प्रेरणा, दूसरों का घर जलाने की और नारियों के अपमान की कुशिक्षा अधर्म है और ईश्वर का घोर अपमान है।

धर्म और सम्प्रदाय :— धर्म अत्यन्त व्यापक विचार है। इसमें मानवता के श्रेष्ठ विचार और भाव निहित हैं। धर्म किसी एक व्यक्ति के उपदेश या शिक्षाओं को नहीं कहते। किसी एक ही महापुरुष, पैगम्बर या अवतार के उपदेशों से सम्प्रदाय बनते हैं, धर्म नहीं।

भारत में साम्प्रदायिकता की समस्या :— वैदिक धर्म या सनातन धर्म संसार का आदि धर्म हैं। यह किसी पुरुष विशेष के उपदेशों, शिक्षाओं या संदेशों पर आधारित नहीं है। इसकी अनेक शाखाएँ तथा उपशाखाएँ हैं। बौद्ध, जैन, सिख आदि सम्प्रदाय इसी से विकसित हुए हैं। विदेशी आक्रमणकारियों के साथ भारत में इस्लाम तथा ईसाई धर्मों (सम्प्रदायों) का आगमन हुआ है।

भारत में साम्प्रदायिकता की समस्या भारत के मूल सनातन धर्म तथा अन्य सम्प्रदायों के वैचारिक अंतर से संबंधित है। साम्प्रदायिक कटुता के कारण अपने ही सम्प्रदाय को अच्छा मानना, दूसरों को बलपूर्वक अपना धर्म अपनाने को बाध्य करना आदि साम्प्रदायिकता का मूल कारण है। भारत में यह समस्या मूलतः हिन्दू और इस्लाम धर्म के बीच है।

साम्प्रदायिक द्वेष के जहर को इस देश ने शताब्दियों से झेला है। 1947 में देश के विभाजन के समय खून की जो होली खेली गई थी वह आज भी कोढ़ के रूप में चाहे जब फूट निकलती है। इसका परिणाम होता है — हत्या, आगजनी, लूट, बलात्कार और अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय समुदाय में देश की बदनामी।

कराड़ो रूपयों की सम्पत्ति का विनाश होता है, द्वेष की खाइयाँ और गहरी हो जाती हैं। इस साम्प्रदायिक दुराग्रह ने ही तो सुकरात को जहर परोसा, ईसा को सूली पर चढ़ाया और गांधी के जिगर में गोली उतारी है।

संतो, फकीरों और साहित्यकारों के उपदेश :— भारत के संतों, फकीरों तथा साहित्यकारों ने सदा साम्प्रदायिक एकता का संदेश तथा उपदेश दिया है। सबसे पहले संत कबीर हैं जिन्होंने हिन्दुओं तथा मुसलमानों को धर्म का मर्म न समझने के लिए फटकारा है —

हिन्दु कहै मोहि राम पियारा, तुरक कहै रहिमाना।

आपस में दोऊ लरि —लरि मुए, मरम न काहू जाना।।

इसी प्रकार साम्प्रदायिक एकता का उपदेश देने वाले संतो की एक लम्बी श्रृंखला है। इस एकता के सर्वश्रेष्ठ पक्षधर महात्मा गांधी को कौन नहीं जानता ? इकबाल ने कहा है कि मजहब कभी आपस में बैर करना नहीं सिखाता —

मजहब नहीं सिखाता आपस में बैर रखना

हिन्दी हैं हम वतन है हिन्दोस्ता हमारा।

अकबर इलाहाबादी तो दशहरा और मुहर्रम साथ —साथ मनाने की कामना करते हैं।

मुहर्रम और दशहरा साथ होगा।

निबह उसका हमारे हाथ होगा।

खुदा की तरफ से है यह संयोग इत्यादि

सच्चा धर्म और उसकी शिक्षा :— सच्चा धर्म मानवता है। धर्म बैर नहीं सिखाता वह तो एकता की शिक्षा देता है क्योंकि सभी मनुष्य एक ही ईश्वर की संतान हैं। धर्म मित्रता की शिक्षा देता है, शत्रुता की नहीं।

उपसंहार :— आज देश को साम्प्रदायिक सद्भाव की अत्यंत आवश्यकता है। अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय शक्तियाँ और द्वेषी पड़ोसी हमें कमजोर बनाने और विखंडित करने पर तुले हुए हैं। ऐसे समय में देशवासियों को परस्पर मिल — जुलकर रहने की परम आवश्यकता है।

मंदिर—मस्जिद के नाम पर लड़ते रहने का परिणाम देश के लिए बड़ा घातक हो सकता है। अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय क्षेत्र में बदनामी होती है। अर्थतंत्र पर भारी बोझ पड़ता है। अतः हम प्रेम और सद्भाव से रहें, कितना अच्छा है।

एक जिद थी कि समाज को ये बता सकूँ कि यदि इरादे पक्के हों और हौसलों की उड़ान ऊँची हो तो सारी बेड़ियाँ टूट सकती हैं। इस जिद ने मेरी जिंदगी बदल दी। मैंने मोटरसाइकिल चलाकर लिम्का बुक ऑफ वर्ल्ड रिकार्ड में नाम दर्ज करवाया। मैंने हिमालय में कार रैली में हिस्सा लिया। गुजरात के कच्छ में कार चलाई। 2010 में राष्ट्रमंडल खेलों में भी हिस्सा लिया 10 सालों तक दुनिया के मंच पर खुद को साबित करती रही। इन 10 सालो में 58 गोल्ड मैडल एवं अन्य पदक 10 अंतर्राष्ट्रीय प्रतियोगिताओं में जीत चुकी हूँ।

रियो पैरालंपिक में पदक जीतने के लिए प्रत्येक दिन 9 घंटे से भी ज्यादा मेहनत की तब कहीं जाकर छह प्रयास में 4.61 मीटर गोला फेंकने में रजत पदक हासिल किया।

बस अब युवतियों एवं दिव्यांगो से यही कहती हूँ कि खुद को कभी कमजोर नहीं समझें और लगातार कठिन परिश्रम कर आगे बढ़ें।

लता मंगेशकर (हेमा मंगेशकर) का जन्म 28 सितंबर 1929 में हुआ। उनकी मृत्यु 6 फरवरी 2022 में हुई। वे एक भारतीय गायिका और संगीतकार थीं।

उन्हें व्यापक रूप से भारत में सबसे महान् और सबसे प्रभावशाली गायकों में से एक माना जाता था। सात दशकों के कैरियर में भारतीय संगीत उद्योग में उनके योगदान ने उन्हें नाइटिंगेल ऑफ इंडिया और क्वीन ऑफ मेलोडी जैसी सम्मानजनक उपाधियाँ प्रदान की। प्रसिद्ध पार्श्व गायिका लता मंगेशकर को उनकी विशिष्ट आवाज और मुखर रेंज के लिए जाना जाता था।

उनका जन्म 28 सितंबर 1929 को इंदौर, भारत में हुआ था। वह पाँच भाई—बहनों में सबसे बड़ी थीं। उनके पिता पंडित दीनानाथ मंगेशकर थे और उनकी माता शेवंती थीं। उनके पिता एक प्रसिद्ध मराठी मंच व्यक्तित्व थे, जिन्हें लोकप्रिय रूप से मास्टर दीनानाथ के नाम से जाना जाता था। उन्हें कम उम्र में संगीत से परिचित कराया गया था।

13 साल की उम्र में, उन्होंने वसंत जोगलेकर की मराठी फिल्म किटी हसाल के लिए अपना पहला गाना रिकॉर्ड किया। लता मंगेशकर के जन्म का नाम “हेमा” था। बाद में, उनके माता—पिता ने उसका नाम बदल दिया और लता नाम रखा।

जन्म क्रम में उसके भाई— बहनों के नाम मीना, आशा, उषा और हृदयनाथ हैं। सभी कुशल गायक और संगीतकार हैं। उनके शैक्षणिक कैरियर के बारे में ज्यादा जानकारी नहीं है लेकिन उन्होंने साबित कर दिया कि केवल डिग्री ही कमाने का जरिया नहीं है। संगीत की पहली शिक्षा उन्हें अपने पिता से मिली।

लता मंगेशकर को “बॉलीवुड की कोकिला” कहा जाता है। निःसंदेह भारत की सबसे प्रसिद्ध और सम्मानित महिला आवाजों में से एक है। मंगेशकर हिंदी और भारतीय क्षेत्रीय सिनेमा उद्योगों में सात दशकों से अधिक समय तक चलने वाले गायन के कैरियर के साथ संघर्ष करने के लिए एक ठोस ताकत है।

गोल्डन वॉयस वाली महिला ने न केवल एक हजार से अधिक हिंदी फिल्मों के लिए गीत गाकर हिंदी फिल्म जगत् पर एक अमिट छाप छोड़ी है। बल्कि उन्होंने 36 से अधिक क्षेत्रीय भारतीय और अन्य भाषाओं के गीतों में भी अपनी आवाज़ दी है। लता का जन्म घर की सबसे बड़ी बेटी के रूप में हुआ था। इसलिए, गायन उनके पास जल्दी आ गया। चूंकि उनके पिता भी एक थिएटर पेशेवर थे, लता और उनके भाई—बहनों को बड़े मंच पर जल्दी ही उजागर किया गया था। उनके पिता की असामयिक मृत्यु हुयी जब वह एक बच्ची थीं, तो उन्हें अपने परिवार के लिए कमाने वाली की भूमिका निभाने की आवश्यकता थी, जो आपने सराहनीय रूप से किया।

भारतीय अर्थव्यवस्था

भारतीय अर्थव्यवस्था की प्रकृति कृषि प्रधान है। स्वतंत्रता के बाद भारत ने 1950—51 में अपनी पहली पंचवर्षीय योजना शुरू की तब से हर 5 साल पर पंचवर्षीय योजना चलाई जा रही है जो देश की अर्थव्यवस्था और विकास के लिए जरूरी होता है। भारतीय अर्थव्यवस्था कृषि पर आधारित है लेकिन उद्योगों, सेवा क्षेत्र और सामाजिक आर्थिक बुनियादी ढाँचे के विकास पर बहुत जोर दिया गया है। जैसे शिक्षा, स्वास्थ्य, आवास, शक्ति परिवहन, संचार आदि।

भारतीय अर्थव्यवस्था को तीन प्रमुख भागों में विभाजित किया जा सकता है।

- प्राथमिक या कृषि क्षेत्र** — इस क्षेत्र में कृषि और इसकी सहयोगी मछली पकड़ना, वानिकी, पशुपालन आदि शामिल हैं।
- द्वितीयक या विनिर्माण क्षेत्र** — इस क्षेत्र को औद्योगिक क्षेत्र के रूप में भी जाना जाता है जिसमें सभी प्रकार के विनिर्माण क्षेत्र में छोटे एवं बड़े उद्योग शामिल होते हैं। जैसे कुटीर उद्योग, कपड़ा उद्योग मोमबत्ती, माचिस, मुर्गी पालन आदि शामिल हैं। ये इकाईयाँ बहुत बड़ा रोजगार प्रदान करती हैं।
- तृतीयक या सेवा क्षेत्र** — यह क्षेत्र परिवहन, संचार, बैंकिंग, बीमा, व्यापार और वाणिज्य जैसी सेवाओं का उत्पादन होता है। जिससे राष्ट्रीय और अंतर्राष्ट्रीय क्षेत्रों की तरह व्यापार शामिल है। इसके अलावा डॉक्टर, इंजीनियर, शिक्षक, वकील आदि सेवा क्षेत्र के अंतर्गत आते हैं।

निष्कर्ष — आउटसोर्सिंग (बाहरी स्रोतों से सेवाएँ प्राप्त करने वाली कंपनी) हमारी अर्थव्यवस्था के लिए सबसे बड़ा वरदान है। हमारे पास सूचना प्रौद्योगिकी उत्पादों के साथ —साथ व्यवसायिक प्रक्रिया आउटसोर्सिंग के लिए एक पंसदीदा गंतव्य बनाने में सहायक रहती है।

नई शिक्षा नीति में हिन्दी का महत्व

14 सितम्बर को पूरे देश में हिंदी दिवस के रूप में मनाया जाता है। इसका कारण यह है कि 14 सितम्बर 1949 को संवैधानिक स्तर पर भारत संघ की राजभाषा हिंदी और लिपि देवनागरी को मान्यता प्राप्त हुई थी। संविधान में कहा गया था कि धारा 343 के अंतर्गत” संघ की राजभाषा हिंदी और लिपि देवनागरी होगी और अंको का रूप भारतीय अंकों का अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय रूप होगा। शासकीय प्रयोजनों के लिए अंग्रेजी भाषा का प्रयोग 15 वर्ष की अवधि तक किया जाता रहेगा। इस संबंध में 1955 में राजभाषा आयोग बना। हिन्दी को राजभाषा के रूप पूर्णतः स्थापित करने की प्रक्रिया में आयोग द्वारा तेरह सुझाव दिये गये जिन पर सरकार द्वारा कोई ठोस कदम नहीं लिया गया। यह हमारा दुर्भाग्य है कि सरकारी नीतियों के कारण आज भी हिंदी राजभाषा में सहायक के रूप में कार्य कर रही है और एक विदेशी भाषा हमारी प्रमुख राजभाषा के रूप में शासकीय प्रयोजनों, वार्ताओं, पत्रों, अभिलेखों की आधार भाषा बनी हुई है।

भाषा है ज्ञान का रास्ता— भाषा ज्ञान के रास्तों को खोलती है लेकिन हमारे ही देश में अंग्रेजी पर हम सभी की अति निर्भरता ने गाँव, कस्बों व शहरों तक के विद्यार्थियों को अंग्रेजी भाषा ने ज्ञान के अभाव के कारण विज्ञान और तकनीकी ज्ञान से वंचित कर दिया है। अगर हम अपने आस पास ही देखे तो विद्यालय तक विज्ञान की शिक्षा हिन्दी में लेने वाला छात्र उच्च शिक्षा में प्रवेश के समय अंग्रेजी पाठ्यक्रम व अंग्रेजी भाषा की अनिवार्यता व हिंदी भाषा में पाठ्यपुस्तकों में अभाव के कारण विज्ञान व तकनीकी पाठ्यक्रमों से दूरी बना लेता है। यह हमारी शिक्षा व भाषा नीति की विफलता है कि वह एक ओर आजादी के इतने वर्षों उपरान्त भी हम ज्ञान—विज्ञान के पाठक्रमों को हिन्दी, मातृभाषा व क्षेत्रीय भाषाओं में उपलब्ध कराने में असमर्थ हैं, जो थोड़ा बहुत उपलब्ध भी हो रहा है वह अनुवाद मात्र है और स्तरीय नहीं है। भाषा की इस दुरुहता के कारण हमारी बहुत—सी प्रतिभाओं को सामने आने का मौका नहीं मिल पा रहा है।

नई शिक्षा नीति में हिन्दी का महत्व — भारतीय शिक्षा व्यवस्था को व्यवस्थित व क्रमबद्ध रूप से आगे बढ़ाने और आज की जरूरत को ध्यान में रखते हुए भारत सरकार ने नई शिक्षा नीति 2020 लागू की है जो राष्ट्रीय व अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर चर्चा का विषय बनी हुई है। नई शिक्षा नीति 2020 में भाषा के संबंध में उत्पन्न उन सभी सवालों को समझा व नई शिक्षा नीति का हिस्सा बनाया गया है जिस पर अमूमन पूरे देश में प्रत्येक हिन्दी दिवस पर चर्चा होती आ रही है। इस नीति के अंतर्गत भी राजभाषा आयोग 1955 की सिफारिशों में से एक भारतीय भाषाओं के ज्ञान और सीखने की सिफारिश को शामिल किया गया है, जबकि इससे पूर्व 1968 में कोठारी आयोग (1964—66) जिसे भारतीय शिक्षा के इतिहास में पहला कदम कहा जाता है। वह शिक्षा को राष्ट्रीय महत्व का विषय घोषित करता है। 14 वर्ष की आयु के सभी बच्चों के लिए अनिवार्य शिक्षा का लक्ष्य रखता है। संस्कृत भाषा के शिक्षण को प्रोत्साहित करने व त्रिभाषा सूत्र को लागू करने की सिफारिश करता है।

नई शिक्षा नीति — नई शिक्षा नीति में कुछ निम्नलिखित महत्वपूर्ण बिन्दु शामिल किये गये हैं—

- विज्ञान सहित सभी विषयों में उच्चतम गुणवत्ता वाली पाठ्य पुस्तकों को मातृ भाषा में उपलब्ध कराया जाएगा।
- बच्चे द्वारा बोली जाने वाली भाषा और शिक्षण के माध्यम के बीच यदि कोई अंतराल मौजूद होता है तो उसे समाप्त किया जाएगा।
- भाषा के विकास में त्रिभाषा सूत्र को पुनः शामिल किया गया और कहा गया कि इसमें कम से कम दो भारतीय भाषाएँ होगी।
- संस्कृत, पालि, फारसी, प्राकृत के साथ ही तमिल, तेलुगु, कन्नड़, मलयालम और ओडिशा भाषाओं को भी विकल्प के रूप में शामिल किया जाएगा व पाठ्यक्रम का हिस्सा बनाया जाएगा।

अब लड़कियों की शादी की न्यूनतम उम्र 18 से बढ़ाकर 21 वर्ष कर दी गई है। 16 दिसम्बर 2021 को ‘ स्पेशल मैरिज एक्ट’ पर केन्द्रीय सरकार ने संशोधन किया है। इस संशोधन के अनुसार— जब तक लड़कियों की उम्र 21 वर्ष पूर्ण नहीं हो जाती, तब तक लड़कियों का विवाह करना एक गैर कानूनी अपराध माना जाएगा।

उद्देश्य — यह संशोधन का मुख्य उद्देश्य महिलाओं को स्वस्थ बनाना और कुपोषण से बचाना है। यह संशोधन केवल एक धर्म के पुरुष और महिलाओं के लिए नहीं हैं, यह सभी धर्मों के लिए समान रूप से कार्यरत हैं। सरकार ने अब महिला और पुरुष के विवाह की उम्र 21 वर्ष कर दी है।

इस अधिनियम के लाभ —इस संशोधन के तहत अब लड़की में और मैच्युरिटी आ जायेगी, ताकि वह समाज की बुराइयों को आसानी से समझ पाएगी और उसका निवारण निकाल पाएगी।

- दूसरा, कि जो महिलाएँ समय से पूर्व माँ बन जाती थी अब सही समय में उन पर दुष्प्रभाव नहीं पड़ेगा।
- तीसरा, कि अब लड़कियों को उज्ज्वल भविष्य के सपनों को साकार करने का अवसर भी मिल जाएगा।
- हालांकि नेशनल हेल्थ फैमिली सर्वे—5 में पाया गया कि अब भारत में बाल विवाह की संख्या में कमी आई हैं।

नुकसान— इस संशोधन के कारण प्रेम विवाह करने वाले जोड़ों को एक परेशानी का सामना करना पड़ेगा।

- वही विपक्ष में असादुद्दीन ओवैसी का कहना है कि अगर 18 साल की लड़की जब वोट दे सकती है, तो 18 साल की उम्र में वह अपना पार्टनर क्यों नहीं चुन सकती।
- हालाँकि इस संशोधन को लेकर विवादित कथन भी देखने को मिल रहे हैं।
- मोदी सरकार ने अगर इस संशोधन को लाया है तो महिलाओं के स्वास्थ्य और उज्ज्वल भविष्य का देखकर ही ला रहे है।

सभी धर्म ग्रंथ एक जैसे नहीं होते कुछ जैसे की भक्ति, वेदांत या बौद्ध, जैन, यूनानी और मिस्र के धर्मात्माओं कंप्यूशियस और रिंटो आदि ग्रंथ अपने से विपरीत विचारधारा को सम्मान देते हैं या उनसे बात करने को तैयार रहते हैं या कुछ और ग्रंथ हैं जैसे बाइबिल या कुरान ये मानकर चलते हैं कि इंसानी दिमाग पिछड़ा हुआ है और तर्क संगत दृष्टि से आगे नहीं बढ़ सकता।

सच तो ये है कि फसलें हमारे लिए नहीं उगती फल और मसाले इसलिए स्वादिष्ट नहीं होते हैं ताकि वो इंसान को अच्छे लगे। फसलें उगती और इंसान उन्हें खाते हैं। नदियाँ इसलिए नहीं बहती क्योंकि हमें पानी की आवश्यकता है नदियाँ बहती हैं इसलिए हमें पानी मिलता है। डायनासोर के जमाने में भी नदियाँ बहा करती थी, फूल खिलते थे और आकाश में तारे भी चमकते थे। जब पृथ्वी में हिमयुग चल रहा था यहाँ तक पृथ्वी के जन्म से पहले भी सूर्य और तारा आकाश में बेरोकटोक चमकते थे अगर हमारे सूर्य और हो जाए तो बाकी ये ब्रह्मांड को उतना ही फर्क पड़ेगा जितना एक जुगनू के चमकने से दिन की रोशनी को फर्क पड़ता है।

एक ऐसा अनंत और आविचलित ब्रह्मांड जिसे सैकड़ों सूर्य और समूहों की मृत्यु से कोई फर्क नहीं पड़ता इस लिए हम ईश्वर मान सकते हैं पर ये विचार हमारे कल्पना के ईश्वर से बिल्कुल अलग हैं। ये मानवता नहीं होगा। ये ब्रह्मांड का ईश्वर होगा पृथ्वी पर मानव जीवन का प्रकट होना और पृथ्वी का ब्रह्मांड के अनंत चक्र के बीच प्रकट होना ये दोनों बातें बहुत छोटी हैं इतनी छोटी की ब्रह्मांड के इतिहास में इनका जिक्र भी जरूरी नहीं होगा प्रकृति का हमारे अनुकूल होना एक संयोग मात्र है जब तक ये संयोग जारी है तब तक हम जिन्दा रहेंगे और जब तक हम जिंदा हैं तब तक हम इस संयोग को ईश्वर मानकर कुछ फूल अर्पण कर सकते हैं।

जरा सोचिये हम विकास की दौड़ में बिना लगाम के घोड़े की तरह क्यों दौड़ रहे है? स्थिति मजबूत होगी। हमें संसाधनों की कमी नहीं होगी हम एक खुशहाल जीवन जी सकेंगे। लेकिन हम ऐसी जिंदगी कैसे जियेंगे। ऐसे विकास का क्या करेंगे, जहाँ हम खुली शुद्ध हवा में साँस न सके, शुद्ध पानी न पी सके। जब खेत खलिहानों, जंगलों को नष्ट कर बड़ी फैक्ट्री, शॉपिंग मॉल बनेंगे तो हम अनाज कहाँ आयेगे, जब हम आज ही सारे प्राकृतिक संसाधनों का उपयोग कर लेगे तो हम अपनी आने वाली पीढ़ी के लिए क्या छोड़ के जायेगे? विरासत में क्या देकर जायेंगे?

हमें सतत पोषणीय विकास के मूल्यों को ध्यान में रखकर विकास करना होगा। अर्थात् भविष्य की जरूरतों को ध्यान में रखकर वर्तमान की पूर्ति करना। ताकि हम आज भी संसाधनों का उपयोग कर सके और भविष्य के लिए भी इन्हें संजोकर रख सकें। संसाधनों का मितव्यता पूर्ण उपयोग करना होगा।

स्वच्छ और स्वस्थ पर्यावरण हमारे विकास का एक अति महत्वपूर्ण अंग है। जब तक हमारे मानव संसाधन को स्वस्थ और स्वच्छ पर्यावरण नहीं मिलेगा। वह विकास की सीढ़ी कैसे चढ़ेगा? क्योंकि जब तक किसी देश का मानव संसाधन स्वस्थ नहीं वह देश विकास नहीं कर सकता। क्योंकि एक स्वस्थ शरीर में ही स्वस्थ मस्तिष्क का निर्माण होता है और एक स्वस्थ मस्तिष्क ही स्वस्थ विकास कर सकता है।
