Aloysians kept the flag of the institution high for the year by achievements in academics, extracurricular and co-curricular activities.


The College hosted one International Conference, two National Seminars and one National Workshop. The International Conference on "Exploring Trends and Practices in Information Technology and Management" was a joint venture of the Department of Computer Science and Management Studies sponsored by UGC, and MPCST, Bhopal. Over 200 participants from all over the country and abroad attended, making it a grand success.

The Department of Zoology and Biotechnology organized a three days National Workshop on "Applied Techniques in Biology" sponsored by UGC, Bhopal. Several modern techniques like PCR restriction Endonuclease cleavage of DNA and DNA isolation and visualization were demonstrated and more than 70 research scholars and young teachers participated.

A Seminar was organized by the Department of Hindi on "Rashtriya Ekta Sanvardhan Mein Sant Ravidas ke Vicharo Ki Prasingigta" sponsored by UGC, Bhopal. The conference was attended by 170 delegates from all over the country.

Another UGC sponsored National Seminar was organized by the Department of Economics on "RUSA: A Strategic Intervention for Enhancement of Higher Education in India". The total number of participants was 107.

The College teachers and students both continued contributing effectively in quality research activity with both right aptitude and attitude. The college provides favorable research environment for working on research projects and research articles to derive maximum benefit of research. Nine Minor and two Major Research Projects were undertaken this year by the teachers thereby contributing significantly to their respective fields. Seven Minor Research projects were completed. Four books have been authored by the teachers. Teachers of the college attended 46 International and 94 National Seminars, Conferences, and Workshops throughout the year. In the field of publication 89 Research papers and articles were published in journals of International and National repute and 10 chapters were published by the faculty members in various edited books.



A significant achievement was that the college started the publication of "Journal of Multidisciplinary Research Studies (JMRS)" a peer reviewed journal which was released on 24th March 2015.


This Year the College was identified and granted support on Level-1 Category by DST (Department of Science and Technology) for FIST. The Department of Physics was approved as a Research Centre for Physics under Rani DurgavatiVishwavidyalaya, Jabalpur. This will further facilitate better publications and research activities in the coming years.

Yet another leap for providing value added to the students, a Seminar for PG Students on 'Fundamental Principles of Chemistry and its Applications' was organized by Department of Chemistry and also to instill logical reasoning a seminar on Mathematical Curves was organized by the Department of Mathematics for B.Sc.students. The Department of Computer Science organized a two days' workshop on "Ethical Hacking" in collaboration with IIT Jodhpur The Department of Physics organized "National Robotics Workshop cum Championship" in collaboration with IIT Bombay & ARK Techno-solutions, in which 110 students from various institutions participated.

The College holds high record in selection of students in NCC. Five NCC cadets viz., Cdt. Prajwal Thapa, Cdt. Swapnil Baronia, Cdt. Abhishek Singh, Cdt. ShikhaBharti, Cdt. Sharanya Khamparia were selected for the most prestigious Republic Day Camp held at New Delhi. In the naval wing UO Swati Pillai, UO Joyce Angela, CPL Seema Devi, CPL Monika Sharma attended the Thal Sainik Camp at Delhi. Cadet Ambika Singh of the naval platoon was selected for Nau Sainik Camp which is the most prestigious camp of Naval NCC held at Gwalior.

In Sports, Table Tennis (Men), Table Tennis (Women), Badminton(Men), Basketball(Men) and Hockey(Men) teams were Winners and Volleyball(Men), Football(Men), Handball(Men), Basketball(Women) Badminton (Women) and Kabaddi (Women) teams were Runners-up at the Intercollegiate level. Nine students participated at the National, 45 at the University and 55 at the District level.

In co-curricular and extracurricular activities Tripti Moses of B. Sc VI semester participated at the 30th All India Inter University National Youth Festival sponsored by Ministry of Youth Affairs in Sports and All India Universities (AIU). She was placed fourth in Solo Vocal Western Singing Competition. The College Western Solo (Vocal) Song, One Act Play and Quiz teams participated in the 30thInter-University Central Zone Youth Festival, where the college team of Western Vocal Solo was placed first and the One Act Play was placed third. The College Western Solo (Vocal) Song, One Act Play, Group Song (Indian) and Quiz teams secured first position at the State Level Inter University Youth Festival and Inter- District University Level Youth Festival.



Various fests were held to hone the students talents in dance, singing, dramatics, fine arts and literary activities. The department of Zoology and Biotechnology organized BIOFEST. The Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry organized CHEMFEST. The Department of Botany and Microbiology, organized ECOFEST on the theme to make environment Polythene Free. The Department of Mathematics organized the Pythagorean Fest.

The Department of Computer Science and Application organized Techno Zion that provided students to convert their thoughts into reality.

The institution has always been on the forefront in contributing to society through its social work activities with an aim towards the upliftment of the lower strata of society. The College conducted various Awareness Programme on AIDS, Tobacco, Hepatitis, and Typhoid, Road Shows on Conservation of Nature, Nukkad Nataks, Blood Donation Camp. Visits to Prisons, Orphanages, Blind Schools, Old-age Homes, and Asha Kendra were also part of the college activities. The institution aims at character building and sensitizes the youth so as make them better citizens of a progressive society. The NSS Girls Camp was organized at Munditoriya from 11th to 17th March 2015. Thirty students participated in this camp. The NSS Camp for boys was organized at Paraswada from 23rd February, 2015 to 01st March, 2015. Swach Bharat Abhiyan was the theme of the camp wherein 35 students participated.

The Alumni Association of St. College established the Alumni Association Office on 14th September, 2014.

The result in the academic year 2014-15 was satisfactory. The aggregate percentage of result for the Sixth Semester was 84.37%. The total number appeared was 791 of which 699 students passed, 84 got ATKT and 08 failed. For the Post Graduate classes the aggregate result for IV Semester was 84.37%. The total number who appeared was 166 of which 147 passed and 17 had ATKT.
