The long journey undertaken since 1951 and this year stood witness to many achievements in curricular, co-curricular and extension activities that brought recognition to the College in diverse realms of endeavors.

In order to provide an extra edge to teachers in the teaching -learning process and strengthen students profile as future architects of the nation, the College organized two day Workshop on "Human Value and Development Programme" on 16th and 17th June, 2016 in collaboration with All India Association for Christian Higher Education, New Delhi (AIACHE).

The Department of Commerce successfully organized a UGC sponsored two day National Seminar on "Make in India: A Key for Economic Growth in India" on 18th and 19th March 2016. Around 300 participation and 170 paper presentation.

Research and publication for the year: 83 research articles and papers were published in reputed National and International Journals, 02 chapters were published in books, 04 books published were authored, 02 books published were edited and one text book published by the college teachers. The "Journal of Multidisciplinary Research Studies (JMRS)" a peer-reviewed journal was published with standard research papers. Six Minor and one Major research projects are ongoing. Faculty members attended 18 International Conferences, 125 National Seminars and 77 National Workshops. New infrastructure has been added in the form of Central Research Centre established under FIST for Science subjects, English Language Lab, staff toilets, students' toilets, and two classrooms.

Co-curricular activities: The Aloysians have participated in 23 various cultural activities at the intercollegiate level, in which in six events they secured first position, four events they secured second and in three events they secured third position. The One Act Play, "Brijish Kadar ka Kunba" was placed first in the Inter Collegiate, Inter- District and Inter University State and qualified for Central Zonal level. In Quiz, Divyansh Rai secured second position in Inter Collegiate level, first position in Inter University and Central Zonal level. Various fests were held like Chem-Fest, Eco-Fest, Lit-Fest, Techno Zion, Bio-Fest and Zoo-Mania organized by



department of Chemistry & Biochemistry, Botany, English, Computer Science & Application and Zoology of the College in order to channelize the latent talents to the students by providing them a platform.

Extra-curricular activities: The Western Group Song secured first position at Inter Collegiate and Inter District and secured second position at Inter University State Level. In Solo Classical Song Tanmay Agrawal secured first position in Inter Collegiate and Inter District level. In Inter University State Level secured second position. In Western Solo Song Tripti Moses secured first position in Inter Collegiate, Inter District, and Inter University State and Central Zonal level. Three of the students namely Tripti Moses, Divyansh Rai and Tanmay Agrawal qualified for National level Youth Festival held at Mysore and Tripti Moses secured third position at the National level. 08 students participated at the national, 43 at the state, 58 at the district and University and 10 at the All India University. The college was winner at the intercollegiate level in Table Tennis (Men & Women), Badminton (Men & Women), Basketball (Men & Women), Cricket and Football (Men). The College was Runner-up in Kabbadi (Men & Women), Chess (Men & Women), and Volleyball (Men). Ranvijay Singh secured first position in 400mts, 800mts and 1500 mts in All India Athletics Nationals and awarded Rs 10000 by the Ministry of Youth & Sports Affairs, Kanchan Dhanuk who participated in 5 km Marathon race and secured first position and was awarded Rs 3000, Kapil Kesharwani participated in Open National Handball and Shakshi Pandey attended India Camp in Basketball.

Activities under NCC: The College holds a record in NCC for both boys and girls The Union Defence Minister Commendation was received by Senior Cadet Captain S.M. Shahid Shaikh at New Delhi for being the most active cadet. Cadet Sharanya Khamparia received the Chief Minister Commendation and the Defence Secretary Commendation Award at Bhopal along with a cash prize of Rupees Ten thousand for her overall achievements. Three Naval cadets L. Abhishek Singh, Swapnil Baronia and Sharanya Khamparia visited Russia, Singapore and Sri Lanka respectively for the International Youth Exchange Programme (YEP). Cadet Vivek Rajput was selected for the International Naval Cruise and he visited Dubai, Yemen and Oman, Cadet Praveen Kumar and Alok Choubey attended the Republic Day Camp at New Delhi, Cadet Anushikha Dwivedi and Cadet Praveen Kumar attended the Nau Sainik Camp at Karwar, U/O Poonam Saxena attended Thal Sainik Camp at New Delhi, SCC S. M. Shahid and Cadet L. Abhishek Singh attended All India Leadership Camp at Coimbatore. NCC Officer Capt. Sonal Rai received the Chief Minister commendation and was awarded a cash prize of Rupees 50,000 for her dedicated services to NCC.



Activities under NSS: NSS Boys wing organized Seven days Unit camp from 23rd February to 29th February, 2016 at Parswara, Jabalpur and NSS Girls wing organized seven days Unit camp from 12th February to 19th February, 2016 at Munditoriya, Manegaon, Jabalpur. Special classes on Karate was arranged to train girl students to equip them in self-defence. Yoga and meditation classes for both boys and girls were arranged to fight out the growing stress and increase

concentration in studies for better results. Dr. Reena Mahobiya (Art of Living), Swami Rajkumar (Osho). Behan B. K. Bala (Brahma Kumari), Dr. Rachna Jain (Maharishi University) and Rev. Dr. Davis George (Director, SAIT) trained and imparted their knowledge to students. A workshop on disaster management was organized for students to provide knowledge on how to react and behave during natural disasters. A squad of 23 personals from State Disaster Response Force, Jabalpur, (M. P.), supervised by Mr. Shalivahan Pandey, Company Commander, Home Guard, Mr. Sunil Girg, Divisional Commander, Civil Defense, Mr. Pushendra and Mr. Animesh, Platoon Commanders, SDRF, trained the students and demonstrated various rescue operations necessary at the time of emergency.

Institutional Social Responsibilities: The College organized various extension services through clubs and societies. Visit to Orphanage, Blind schools, Old age Homes, Prisons, Asha Kendra, Plantation, Anti-Tobacco Rally, Awareness programmes on AIDS, Cancer, Tobacco via Naukkad Natak, posters are part of the work ethos. Also our students and teachers donated 183 units of blood on the day of blood donation camp organized.

The College celebrates various festivals in collaboration with other institutes of the city under the banner of Jabalpur Inter Religious Forum (JIRF), in order to promote solidarity, brotherhood, love and peace amongst religions. Id -Ul- Fitr was celebrated at Anjuman Islamia Higher Secondary School, Jabalpur. Deepawali was celebrated at St. Thomas Higher Secondary School, Jabalpur. Gurunanak Jayanti was celebrated at Mata Gujiri College, Jabalpur. Christmas was celebrated at St. Aloysius' Institute of Technology (SAIT), Jabalpur. Mahaveer Jayanti was celebrated in the College Premises. This is a special endeavor to encourage communal harmony and increase the spirit of brotherhood within different communities and society.

Placement Cell had arranged 19 Campus Drives including thirteen Close campus and six Open placement drives. Reputed Companies from all over the country like TCS, ASUS, Uber, Flipkart, Yahoo, Singpost, HR Capital Boosters, Equicom, ICICI Prudential Life and DB FM were a few. A total of 275 students have been selected in different companies.
