Research: Three Major Research Projects and four Minor Research Projects are ongoing. This year 121 research papers were published in reputed National and International journals, 49 chapters were published in books, 6 books were authored, 5 books edited and published by the faculty members. Faculty members attended 49 International Conferences, 144 National Seminars and workshops.

Award: The Principal was conferred with the coveted Best Principal award for the year 2016 and 8 teachers were awarded the certificate of appreciation for publication of books at the Grand Finale Golden Jubilee Celebration, AIACHE, at Madurai.

In order to channelize the latent talent of the students various fest were organized by different departments. Lit Fest, Eco Fest, Chem Fest, Bio Fest, Zoomania and Technozion are few fests providing ample opportunities to students. Result: The total number of students who appeared for VI semester was 1089, out of which 1003 number of students passed, 79 had ATKT and 8 failed. The total percentage of result was 92.10%. The total number of PG students was 94, out of which 89 passed, 05 obtained ATKT. The total percentage of result was 94.68%.

Extra-curricular activities: 57 students who participated at the district, 22 at the state and zonal and 04 at the National level competitions. The College stood first in eleven events *viz* Solo Indian Classical Song, Solo Indian Classical Song Light, Indian Group Song, Western Indian Solo Song, Western Group Song, Solo Dance, Instrumental Non Percussion, Debate, Speech, Poster Making and Quiz. The College secured four second positions in the intercollegiate competitions *viz* Cartoon Making, Clay modeling, mimicry and Instrumental percussion. The winners of all eleven categories represented the Rani Durgavati University at state level.

Ms. Tripti Moses, Divayansh Rai, Shristi Haldiya and Rashi Sikarwar participated at the Nationals organized at Shivaji University, Kolahpur, Maharashtra.

Sports: 60 students who participated at the district, 45 at the state and zonal level, 10 at the University, 09 at the National and 02 at the International level. Kapil Kesharwani represented India in Open Handball Tournament at Sri Lankaand Sakshi Pandey attended All India Camp in Basketball and is selected for Indian Junior Team held in Thailand. This year college continued to become winner in many events *viz* Table Tennis (Men & Women), Badminton (Men), Basketball (Men & Women), Handball (Women), Cricket (Women), Volleyball (Men) and was runners up in Badminton (Women), Football (women), Cricket (Men), Chess (Men), Kho - Kho (Men). The college had also won three Gold Medals in Judo and one in Wrestling (Women).

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
