



IQAC Report 2017-2018

Hard work, perseverance and motivation have been the formulary for the College's success since the time of its inception. We had many challenges to meet and targets to be accomplished in the session 2017-18 after being ranked A⁺ with CGPA 3.68/4.00 by the NAAC last year.

Research: Teachers attended 57 international and national conferences and seminars, 38 workshops; 07 chapters were published in books, 20 research papers were presented, 41 research papers were published in reputed journals, 02 monographs were published in newspapers and 05 minor research projects were completed and submitted to UGC.

Conferences and Seminars: The Department of Education organised two days National Workshop on "Collaborative Teaching Strategies for Knowledge Building and Collective Wisdom in Higher Education" on 26-27 October, 2017 sponsored by United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia. A total of 147 participants benefited from this workshop.

The Department of Physics and Electronics organized a two days National Seminar on "Advanced Research Instrumentation Techniques in Materials Science" on 12-13 January, 2018 sponsored by United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia. There were 230 participants in the training programme.

The Department of Mathematics organized a two days National Training Programme on "The Art of Mathematical Modeling as Teaching Pedagogy" on 9-10 February, 2018 sponsored by United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia. There were 120 participants in the training programme.

A two days National Workshop on "e-Learning, MOOCs and Basic ICT skills for Educators" in collaboration with PanditMadan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNTT) was organized by the College on 17-18 March, 2018. A total of 150 members participated in the training programme.

The College encourages students to groom their personalities by participating in fests organized by the various departments of the college. Lit Fest, Chem Fest, Zoomania, Technozion, Bio Fest and Eco Fest provide a spring board to students to hone their skills and be efficient performers.

Result: The total number of students who appeared for VI semester was 1189, out of which 1050 number of students passed, 125 obtained ATKT and 14 students could not clear the exam. The total percentage of result was 88.3. The total number of PG students was 138 out of which 128 passed while 10 obtained ATKT. The total percentage of result was 92.7.

Placement: Eleven companies visited the College for Campus recruitment drive in which 213 students were selected. Companies like Asian Research Indore, Assist Clix Jabalpur, Axis Bank Raipur Circle, BBB Solutions Ahmadabad, Cape Gemini Mumbai, Jaro Education Mumbai, Put on Cart Jabalpur, Samvedana Group Indore, Teleperformance Indore, Wipro Ltd. Mumbai and ETECH Solutions Gandhinagar provided a platform to aspiring students.

Achievements in Sports: The College was winner in Hockey (men), Basketball (men & women), Table Tennis (men & women), Volleyball (men), Handball (women), Kho-Kho (men) and Cricket (men & women) and runners up in Chess (women), Badminton (women) and Football (men). The College students also participated and won three gold medals in Judo (women) and wrestling (men & women).

Cultural Activities: The College teams participated in 22 events organized at the intercollegiate level and secured first positions in ten events, second position in five events and third position in six events. At the Inter district *Yuva Utsav* the College secured six first positions and four second positions. At the Inter University level students participated in seven events and secured second position in quiz and third position in poster making. Abhay Edwin Chacko represented the college at the Inter University (state level) and Inter University (national level) and secured second and fourth positions respectively. Praveen Jhariya secured second position at the Inter University (state level). In Solo Indian Classical song Tanmay Agrawal and Solo Indian Light Shazi Ahmed stood third positions at the Inter university level. Richa Biswal secured third position at the Inter University (national level).

Achievements in NCC: 11 students were selected for the prestigious Republic Day Camp held at Delhi. Three cadets were selected for being the ambassadors of Indian government as part of

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the Youth Exchange Programme. Cadet Captain Rishabh Sharma visited Kazakhstan in the month of May and SUO Ayushi Singh visited Sri Lanka in the month of October and PO Cadet RituShekhar Singh visited Bangladesh in the month of December. Seven cadets were selected for NauSainik Camp held at Karwar and one cadet was selected for Thal Sainik Camp held at New Delhi. Another proud moment was when Cadet Meenakshi Gupta was short listed for Para Jumping Course at Agra.

Activities under NSS: NSS girls unit Camp was organized from 17-22 February, 2018 at Mandotoriya Mohaniya, Jabalpur and 35 girl cadets participated in the camp. Both NCC and NSS unit have really been instrumental in shaping young individuals with right character and optimistic attitude for nation building.

Institutional Social Activities: Blood donation camps, *nukkadnatak*, awareness rally on tobacco free society, AIDS, cancer, human rights, plantation drives are part of the institution's objectives. They also visited blind schools, old age homes, *ashakendra*, prison and contributed to their betterment and organized medical camps, mini fetes etc.

To encourage solidarity, brotherhood and peace among the religions, the College under the banner of Jabalpur Inter Religious Forum celebrated Id-ul-Fitar on 7 July, 2017 at St. Thomas Higher Secondary School, Deepawali and Guru Nanak Jayanti were celebrated together at St. Aloysius Senior Secondary School, Polipathar on 11 November, 2017 and Christmas was celebrated at St. Aloysius' Institute of Technology on 22 December, 2017.
