Research: 58 teachers attended international and national conferences and seminars, 97 workshops, 69 papers were presented at National and 10 research papers were presented at International seminars and conferences, 36 research papers were published in international and 28 papers at national reputed journals,19 chapters were published in books, three books *viz* "Make in India: Dawn of a New Growth Era", "Childhood and Growing Up" and "Financial Management: A Practical Approach" were published by faculty members, one major research project was sanctioned by Department of Science and Technology.


Conferences and Seminars: Four days Faculty Training Workshop for South Asia sponsored by the United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia and hosted by the College was organized from 23-26 October 2018.

A Two days' Workshop on "Revised Assessment and Accreditation Framework for Higher Education in India sponsored by United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia was organised and hosted by the College on 15-16 December 2018. Eighty teachers from the college benefitted from this workshop.

The Women Cell of the College organized a three days National Seminar on "Envisioning a Healthy India: Health, Hygiene, Mother and Child" from 21-23 February 2019 sponsored by UGC, New Delhi. The total number of participants in the seminar was 161 and 71 research papers were presented.

Result: The total number of students who appeared for VI semester was 1289, out of which 1263 number of students passed, 20 had ATKT and 6 failed. The total percentage of result was 97.98%. The total number of students who appeared for PG was 105, out of which 102 students passed, and 3 had ATKT. The total percentage of PG result was 97.14%.






Achievements in NCC: Seven cadets were selected to participate in Republic Day Camp, one in Thal Sainik Camp and six cadets in Nau Sainik Camp *viz* Cadet Aditi Verma, Cadet Anjali Ann Joseph, Cadet Sumit Dwivedi, Cadet Rohit Pandey Cadet Sachet Sharan Sund, Cadet Praful Dubey, Cadet Suraj Pathak and Abha S. John and PO Cadet Ameesha Patel, Cadet, Bahvesh Rai, Cadet Umang Gupta, Cadet Leandra Sequeria, Cadet Anoushka Agnes Aristotle and Abhishek Mahawar. Four cadets had the proud privilege of being selected for the International Youth Exchange Programme (YEP) for the year 2020. Cadet Captain Tammana Singh Thakur and Rajat Shekar Dubey visited Vietnam. Cadet Captain Tammana Singh Thakur was also awarded the DG commendation along with Rs. 20,000 as cash award for her selfless work and dedication. On NCC Day, Cad. Cap. Manish Singh Chouhan and Cad. Cap. Tamanna Singh Thakur was awarded the prestigious Chief Minister Commendation for their valuable services to NCC. Cadet Captain Manish Singh Chouhan and Cadet Abhishek Mahawar visited Malaysia, Singapore, Indonesia and Mauritius, Seychelles, Mozambique under YEP.

Achievements in Curricular activities: Five students from BCA II year *viz* Abhishek Mishra (Team Leader), Aman Kanojia, Muskan Ahirwar, Aditya Gupta, Sakshi Tiwari and Shreya Nema participated in a national level competition organised by the Government of India at Panipat, Haryana and secured second position in the Grand finale on "Smart India Hackathon 2019-Software Edition" on 2-3 March 2019. They won the second prize with a cash prize of Rs.75000/-. Another team of students: Sainjali Nayak, Vaishnavi Singh and Shurabhi Shukla, participated in the National Debate Competition organized by the St. Joseph's College, Tiruchirappalli, Tamil Nadu on 20-21 March 2019. They stood first as a team and won a cash prize of Rs. 50,000/-. The students participate in Lit Fest, SRIJAN, Technozion, AMA Fest to give wings to students to explore their hidden talents and hone their skills as performers.

Extra-Curricular activities: The College teams participated in 22 events organized at the Intercollegiate level and secured first positions in six events *i.e.* mimicry, solo Indian light song, Instrumental percussion, rangoli, clay modeling and debate, second position in eleven events *i.e.* mime, skit, western solo and group song, Instrumental non-percussion, spot painting, collage, poster, drama, debate and speech and third position in two events *i.e.* solo Indian classical and group folk dance. At the Inter district *Yuva Utsav* the College secured two first positions in solo Indian light song and Instrumental non-percussion (Tabla). Also participated in Rotary South



Talent Fest and Rotary Tulica on 9 and 16 September 2018. Participated in 11 events and secured first position in five and second position in one event.

Sports: The college was winner in Basketball (Women), Table Tennis (Men), Volleyball (Men and women), Football (Men and women), Cricket (Women), one Gold medal in Wrestling, two gold in Shooting, two Gold in Taekwondo, two Gold in Wushu, and one Gold in Athletics; was Runner-up in Chess (Women), Basketball (Men), Table Tennis (Women), Handball (Men), Cricket (Men) and Kho Kho (Men). 80 students participated at the district level, 47 at the State level, 14 at the National level, 47 at the University level, and 07 at the All India University level. Divyansh Gupta student of first year participated in All India Wushu Competition and won a Gold medal.

Institutional Social Responsibilities: The NCC, NSS, Women Cell, Rotary Club and Red Ribbon Clubs render their valuable services towards this cause. Visit to blind schools, orphanages, old age homes, and blood donation camps, health checkups for girls and female teachers, awareness rallies and sessions on tobacco, AIDS, *matdata diwas*, plantation drive, human rights, eye donation, and self-defense were part of training of students to fulfill the objectives of the institution. The NSS of the College organised Human Chain on *Matdata Jagrukta* and Pink Day to spread the awareness in society. The NCC, NSS and Red Ribbon Club organized blood donation camp this year and donated 133 units of blood as a voluntary contribution to save the precious human life.

Under the banner of JIRF Deepawali, Gurunanak Jayanti and Christmas were celebrated.

Placement: 18 companies came to the campus for recruitment of students and 196 students were selected by different companies. The Placement Cell organized soft skill and personality development courses, mock interviews, Group Discussions and industrial visits to provide students the exposure and channels for good placements.

MoU: An MoU with East Carolina University, USA was signed on 12 June, 2018.

International Visits: Dr. Fr. Vazhan Arasu attended a three days programme at Taiwan on "Revisioning the Role and Relevance of Christian Universities in a Multi-Religious, Secular Asia" from 15-18 October 2018.
