With indomitable zeal to excel by rendering quality enhancement to the institution and promoting quality education through quality initiatives in curriculum, teaching, learning and evaluation techniques, St. Aloysius' (Autonomous) College, Jabalpur stands as a benchmark institute in the city.

Accolades: Careers' 360, a reputed magazine, in association with ICFAI (Special Issue on India's Best Universities 2020), March 2020:Vol. XII, Issue 3 documented the college to be one of the top-rated colleges, listed state-wise where most students go first. St. Aloysius' College is listed and ranked as number one college in the state of Madhya Pradesh where most students go first. Knowledge Review, another prominent magazine of the country ranked the institution as one of the ten most admired colleges of the country in their special issue on '10 Most Admired Private Universities in India, 2019.' The Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India, New Delhi granted Star College Scheme to the institution.

Research: The College provides research environment to both teachers and students to grow and upgrade their profiles in keeping with the paradigm shifts worldwide. This year teachers attended 172 international and 425 national conferences and seminars organized in India and outside, 55 chapters were published in books, 55 papers were presented at National and 17 research papers were presented at International seminars and conferences, 21 research papers were published in international and 11 papers at national reputed journals, 04 books were Edited; 01 Major and 03 Minor research projects were sanctioned by ICSSR.

Student Exchange Programmes: College organized a Student Faculty Exchange Programme in collaboration with Sophia Girls' College, Ajmer; five students along with one faculty member attended an International Student Faculty Exchange Programme from 27 January 2020 to 2 February 2020.

Global Understanding programme (**GUP**): The institution conducted GUP in association with East Carolina University, USA through virtual platform and organized exchange program with the universities of Russia, China and ECU.

Results: 100% (Open Book Examination was conducted).

Seminars: The institution organized a two day NAAC, sponsored National Seminar on "Accreditation, Ranking and Quality: A Paradigm shift for strategic Enhancement of Higher Education in India" on 8-9 November 2019. In the Inaugural function, the Chief Guest was Prof.

Joseph Dorairaj, Former Vice Chancellor, Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University), Tamil Nadu. In the Valedictory function, the Chief Guest was Prof. A.D.N. Bajpai, Former Vice Chancellor, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, and Guest of Honour was Prof. Vijay Fulari, Head, Department of Physics & USIC/CFC, Shivaji University, Kolhapur. In the seminar, twenty-one research papers were presented and one hundred ten candidates participated.

The Department of Hindi organized a two day National Seminar on "Rashtrabhasha, Rajbhasha Aur Ab Vishvabhasha Hindi –Vishva Vyapaar Ewam Varnijya ke Vishesh Sandharbh Mei", sponsored by ICSSR New Delhi on February 3-4, 2020. In the Inaugural Session, the Chief Guest was Dr. Mridula Sinha (Ex-Governor of Goa) and Guest of Honour was Prof. Kapil Deo Mishra (Vice Chancellor of R.D. University, Jabalpur). Dr. NutanPandey (Assistant Director of Central Hindi Directorate, Delhi) delivered the keynote address. In the Valedictory session, the Chief Guest was Shri Rahul Dev (Senior Reporter, Delhi) and the Guest of Honour was Dr. Deepak Pandey (Assistant Director of Central Hindi Directorate, Delhi). In the two day seminar one hundred and fifty research papers were presented and three hundred and fifty candidates participated and were benefitted.

St. Aloysius' College provides research-rich environment to teachers as well as students. This year teachers attended one hundred and seventy two international and four hundred and twenty five national conferences and seminars organised in India and outside, fifty five chapters were published in books, fifty five research papers were presented at National and seventeen research papers were presented at International seminars and conferences, twenty one research papers were published in international and eleven research papers at national reputed journals, four books were edited; one major and three minor research projects were sanctioned by ICSSR.

Training & Placement: Like every year, the Placement Cell hosted various training programmes and sessions to enhance employability skills of students; twelve companies visited the campus and forty seven students of various UG & PG programmes were offered placements. Through various training sessions and workshops being conducted in the year, around one thousand and six hundred students of the college were benefitted.

NCC: Four NCC cadets were selected to represent India as the Indian Youth Ambassador namely: Cadet Rohit Pandey visited Russia, Senior Cadet Captain Anjali Ann Joseph visited Kazakhstan, Cadet Sachet Sharan Sund visited Sri Lanka, and Senior under Officer Aditi Verma visited Singapore. Senior under Officer Aditi Verma received the Chief Minister Commendation



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for the Best Cadet 2019-20 of the Directorate. This year eight cadets represented the MP & CG Directorate in 2020. Six Cadets were selected for NSC 2019 at Vishakhapatnam.

NSS: The NSS unit (boys & girls) organized a camp at villages. The girls unit organised corona awareness rally, conducted independent thinking on social issues like importance of wearing masks, distribution of masks, putting *sakoras* for birds, using posters for creating consciousness in society to stay at home safely during the pandemic.

Sports: Muskan Kirar represented India at Asian Games 2019 and won silver medal at the games. Divyansh Manoj won a Silver medal in Wushu in an International event. Prajjwal Gupta won a gold medal in Karate, Jayaraj Choudhary won Gold in Flying Kick; Gold and Silver in Taekwondo, Yashika Sharma and Anita Devi won bronze medals in Strength Lifting and cycling respectively. In the intercollegiate events the college was winner in Volleyball (Men & Women), Chess (Men & Women), Table Tennis (Men & Women), Badminton (Men), Basketball (Women). The college won two gold and two silver medals in shooting, two gold, two silver and one bronze in athletics at state level, two gold and one silver at All India University level, one bronze in cycling at All India University level, one silver medal in Wushu at international level and three players were selected for nationals in *Khelo India Khelo* tournament. This year six players represented at international, fifteen at national, fourteen at All India University, Thirty eight at university, thirty two at state, and sixty eight at the district levels.

Inter-Religious Forum: Through JIRF, a body that brings different religions together, St. Aloysius' College celebrated the hues of different festivals this year also. In 2019-20, the institution celebrated Deepawali on 5 November 2019 to mark the festival of lights, joy and happiness. Dr. Jitendra Jamdar, Orthopedic Surgeon, Jamdar Hospital, Jabalpur was the Chief Guest of the function. The 550th birth anniversary of Shri Guru Nanak Devji, was celebrated on 26 November 2019 to communicate the spiritual messages of Shri Guru Nanak Dev amongst the followers of different faiths. Sardar Harjit Singh Kang, Member, Shri Guru Nanak Education Society, Jabalpur, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest of the function. Christmas was celebrated on 20 December 2019 to spread the message of love, joy and peace. Dr. Swami Mukund Das, Maharaj Ji of Gupteshwar *Pethadhesh*, was the Chief Guest of the function.

Prize Distribution Ceremony: The Annual Gold Medal and Certificate Distribution Ceremony were conducted on 15 February, 2020. Prof. Kapil Deo Mishra, Vice Chancellor, Rani Durgavati Vishwavidyalaya, Jabalpur was present as the Chief Guest. On this ceremonious event, forty four gold medals and certificates were distributed to the awardee students.

Annual Social Gathering: On 4 January 2020, Annual Social Gathering was organized. Shri Ravindra Kumar Mishra (IAS), Commissioner of Jabalpur Division graced the occasion as the



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Chief Guest for the gala of cultural events. Prof. Vivek Mishra (Dean, Students Welfare) and Prof. Kamlesh Mishra (Registrar, R.D. University) were present as the Guests of Honour. The programme was presided by Most Rev. Gerald Almeida, Bishop of Jabalpur Diocese. The Aloysians presented a variety of cultural events on this day.

Co-Curricular Activities: Various cultural fests are organised by different departments namely, Kala Utsav, Technozion, SRIJAN, AAGAZ, AMA Fest were organised so that the students may discover their unknown talents and sharpen their skills as talented performers.

MoUs: St. Aloysius' College has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with CMA, Bajaj Finserv, Sophia Girls' College, Ajmer and Patna Womens' College, Patna. With Bajaj Finserv, the College conducted a Certificate Course on CPBFI. Seventy-four students benefitted from this certificate course. The College is also running a course in B.Com with US Career in Management and Accounting (CMA), provided by WILEY, that offers the course all through the country. In collaboration with Patna Women's College, Patna and Sophia Girls' College, Ajmer, two national workshops were organised.

Social Welfare Activities: The upliftment of the downtrodden and the marginalised is the only way to develop a strong nation. The institute leaves no stone unturned to make the students empathise to work for the feeble, old and orphans in society. The Women Cell, Rotary Club and Red Ribbon Clubs render their valuable services towards this cause. This is achieved through bringing awareness in them by paying visits to orphanages, old age homes, mental retarded centers, blind schools, organising blood donation camps, health checkups for girls and female teachers, awareness rallies and sessions on environmental issues, diseases, plantation drive, human rights, eye donation, cyber crime and cyber security and self defense. These are part of training of students to fulfill the objectives of the institution. The institute organised a blood donation camp this year wherein a total of two hundred and thirty seven units of blood was donated.
