

ST. Aloysius College (Autonomous), Jabalpur

The Administrative and Academic Audit of St. Aloysius College (Autonomous), Jabalpur was conducted on **15th July 2022**.

Overall Assessment and Comments

The college submitted self-evaluative reports from each department, which the audit team reviewed before their visit. During the visit, the team met with faculty members to discuss their academic and administrative practices. The audit report shows that the college is on a positive and progressive path, reflecting its commitment to ongoing improvement.

Highlights

St. Aloysius' (Autonomous) College, Jabalpur is devoted to maintaining its heritage of excellence by implementing quality initiatives in the curriculum, pedagogy, learning environment, and assessment of student achievement. "New normal" was initially difficult to accept, but it helped us adjust to our new situation.

The session began online but soon switched to mixed mode. Google meet platforms facilitated efficient teaching-learning online.

The examinations were held offline and academic results were announced promptly. The number of students appeared in undergraduate and post graduate exams are 1634 and 264 respectively. In this session 8 webinars were organized (national/international), one patent was granted, 02 monographs were published, 03 books were published. One Major Research Project is ongoing and 01 Minor Research Project was granted by the ICSSR. The faculty published 27 International and National research papers, 06 in Scopus Index, 03 in Web of Sciences & 07 in UGC Care List and 39 book chapters. One faculty member received the Junior Research Fellowship, two faculty member completed Harvard Bok Higher Education Teaching Certification, three faculty members completed a Professional Certificate course on Adaptive Design for Learning sponsored by United Board for Christian Higher Education conducted by the School of Education and Learning Design, Alteneo Salt Institute, Philippines.

This academic session the institution has witnessed great laurels and accolades. The students were placed at various winning positions in international, national and state level in sports, and co-curricular activities. Also, the institution is a winner under Top Digital Enablers in the Autonomous College Category in the innovation of learning.

Observations

The team highlighted the college's strengths and issues which are as following, based on the data provided by the departments during visit:

Curriculum and syllabi: All of the institution's first-year programs have been updated to conform to NEP 2020's annual implementation pattern. Every program offers an adequate number of elective courses and also various choices of courses that focus on skills and vocational training. The departments have sufficient organization MoU's signed to augment internship and projects. The curriculum includes a variety of different activities, all of which are designed to enhance employability, entrepreneurialism, and skill development.

Teaching Learning and evaluation: The session started off in an online mode, but soon the

classroom teaching-learning resumed in blended mode. The online teaching was conducted on Google meet platforms that expedited efficient teaching-learning throughout the session. Additionally, the addition of around 4000 e-Lectures recorded and saved in a cloud repository has enriched the educational and grading processes. In response to the decision to lift the lockdown at Covid-19, all exams at the undergraduate and graduate levels were moved offline and promptly all academic results were announced.

Student Support: Since the class began online and then transitioned to a mixed learning environment, the Google Classroom platform (licensed Gsuite) was used to provide the students with notes, electronic content, documents, and a variety of evaluation options. The students experienced asynchronous study due to cloud-based video archives of the lectures. By strengthening the digital communication platform, the admission and pre-post examination student support service was determined to be beneficial. The Value-Added Center's courses have been shown to give students better support in developing their language, writing, problem-solving, and presentation abilities. The institution has helped students who are financially challenged; this year, 773 students received scholarships from the state government and 163 received aid from the Aloysius Student Aid Fund.

Campus eco-friendly:

In order to create a sustainable eco-friendly environment, the college has implemented ecologically friendly education and operations. To promote awareness of environmental issues in the community, a variety of activities including nukkad natak, rallies, teaching environmental studies, training programs, lectures, seminars, workshops, projects/research, competitions for writing speeches, posters, and slogans, etc., were held. These activities included addressing the need for a green and clean campus, a plastic-free zone, the best use of waste, reduce, reuse, and recycle, tobacco-free college premises, and health and hygiene. The science laboratories assert the use of green materials and the 100% electronic governance campus. The college has presented a number of road exhibits to the general public to raise awareness of waste management and zero pollution.

Design & Innovation and Entrepreneurship: The DIC team presented on numerous resources available to improve pre-incubation and incubation as well as on-campus initiatives that produced four prototypes—Rosera Wipes, Tamocum, Seed Enhancer, and Biomembrane—and two novel methodologies, namely hydroponics and Olla Pot irrigation.

The Entrepreneurship Cell and IIC reported on numerous programs to develop youth potential by

educating them on various elements of industrial/business activity essential for the establishment of MSEs.

Gender sensitization programmes: For the purpose of educating students about gender equity and equality, the Women's cell and other departments reported a variety of activities and programs. Health awareness programs on "Health & Hygiene," workshops on "making hand sanitizer," essay competitions on "No Gender Only Human," awareness campaigns on "Crime & violence against women," and many other initiatives were carried out.

Institutional Social responsibilities: According to the ISR team, the institution has adopted five villages: Saliwada, Neemkheda, Pipariya Kalan, Khampariya, and Pipariya Khurd. In these villages, a variety of events have been held, including feeding the hungry, promoting sanitary habits and hygiene, providing community services like Swachhata, celebrating religious unity, and more.
