


Objectives:


- 1. Engagement of community by students

Initiative Context: This initiative was undertaken to pursue the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and Swachh Bharat Abhiyan of Central India. The villages are situated in Jabalpur district of Madhya Pradesh. The initiative was planned, instrumentalised and co-ordinated by NSS Units under the guidance of College Principal and Management.

Practice: The NSS unit conducted several meetings with the members of Grama Panchayats of all five villages and started the household survey to spread awareness about swachh Bharat Abhiyan and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. More than 110 NSS volunteers participated and took the pledge of serving the people of these villages in accordance with NSS Motto- "NOT ME BUT YOU". To identify the problems A socio-economic survey was conducted, and counseling sessions/ actions were taken to rectify the problems. **Evidence of Success:** The survey was successfully conducted. 3. "WALL PAINTING"






To encourage the local people for using dustbin, we made a wall painting giving them a message for the same.

For this purpose, NCC Wing along with Red Cross Society organized a Blood Donation on 18th January 2024 where over 150 students donated blood.








Free Medical Camp


The learning outcomes of the Programme were as follows:

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

ed Atul Pandey, District coordinator, Prateel Sinha, Sharad Gupta, Prachi Jain and other students.





Awareness Programme for COVID


The NSS unit of the college organized an awareness programme for COVID precaution. 25 students participated in this programme. The students performed dances and songs to aware the public.




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Visited Snehniketan -School for special children

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






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World Water Day

Save Water Rally







World Earth Day

Virtual Plantation Mission




Vertical Garden with Used Disposable Bottles






Rose Plantation




Environmental Awareness Program

Vermicomposting

Vermicomposting aims to provide a platform for the development of entrepreneurship skill among the students belonging to both rural and urban background. The internship project was designed on the basis of the fact that the municipal wastes; animal wastes, kitchen scraps, non-toxic solids and liquid waste of the industries and household garbage's can be converted into environment friendly, useful and valuable product like Vermifertilizer of economic importance. It is useful for crop production and also alongside helps to maintain a healthy environment. Conversion of garbage by earthworms into Vermicompost and the multiplication of earthworms are simple process and can be easily handled by the students, farmers as well as by the inhabitants of urban society. Vermicompost contains seven times the available potash found in topsoil, as well as five times the available nitrogen and 11 times more calcium delivered gently in organic form to the plants. It does not have any adverse effect on soil, plant and environment. It improves soil nutrition, aeration and texture, thereby reducing soil compaction. It improves water retention capacity of soil because of its high organic matter content. It has a growth-promoting humid substance or phytohormone that accelerates root development and increases crop yield. It lessens pollution, as chemicals are not used and promotes sustainable development.

Above all additional income can also be generated from sale of excess earthworms and Vermicomposting produced. Experimental Design for Vermicomposting-

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




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Mushroom Cultivation

Mushroom Cultivation Every year the team SAMARPAN with help of Department of Botany and Microbiology conducts workshops and training programmes on Mushroom Cultivation for school and college students. From 2020-2021 a certificate course has been designed for Mushroom Cultivation looking into the interest of participants. Mushrooms provide several important nutrients and medicinal molecules.



Indirectly, mushroom cultivation also provides opportunities for improving the sustainability of small farming systems through the recycling of organic matter, which can be used as a growing substrate and then returned to the land as fertilizer. Mushroom cultivation can help reduce vulnerability to poverty and strengthens livelihoods through the generation of a fast yielding and nutritious source of food and a reliable source of income. Small-scale growing does not require any significant capital investment. Mushroom substrate can be prepared from any clean agricultural waste material and mushrooms can be produced in temporary clean shelters.

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
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




School Teaching



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

- Every student paid attention to what the students taught them.




