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National Seminar on Women Empowerment in Madhya Pradesh

Date: September 24th and 25th, 2023

Venue: Conference Hall, St. Aloysius College (Autonomous), Jabalpur

The Women's Cell at St. Aloysius College organized a two-day seminar on "Women Empowerment in India, with a Special Reference to Madhya Pradesh" on September 24th and 25th, 2023. Dr. Anthonima Robin served as the convener, and Dr. Archana Pasari was the chief organizing secretary. The event was attended by 63 participants who gained valuable insights.

Objectives of the Seminar:

- To evaluate the current status of women's empowerment in India, focusing on Madhya Pradesh.
- To discuss and enhance women's education and skill development, improving access and quality.

Day 1 Highlights:

Dr. Neelanjana Pathak spoke on "Economic Empowerment of Women" highlighting government initiatives and policies in Madhya Pradesh that support women's entrepreneurship and access to finance, like gender-responsive budgeting and women's entrepreneurship programs.



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Day 2 Highlights:

The focus was on "Women's Education and Skill Development," by Dr. Reeta Chouhan discussing the importance of quality education and the expansion of vocational training aligned with local market needs to empower women professionally and personally.

Report: A four days National Seminar on “Envisioning a Healthy India: Health, Hygiene, Mother and Child”, was organized in St. Aloysius' College (Autonomous) Jabalpur from 21st to 24th November 2019. The aim of the seminar was to create awareness among the participants about the present scenario of Health and Hygiene in India and also to educate them about the various aspects of mother and child health care.

The seminar comprised of seven sessions with the following themes:

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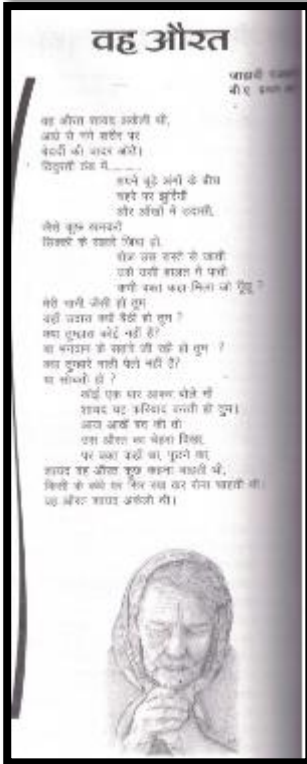
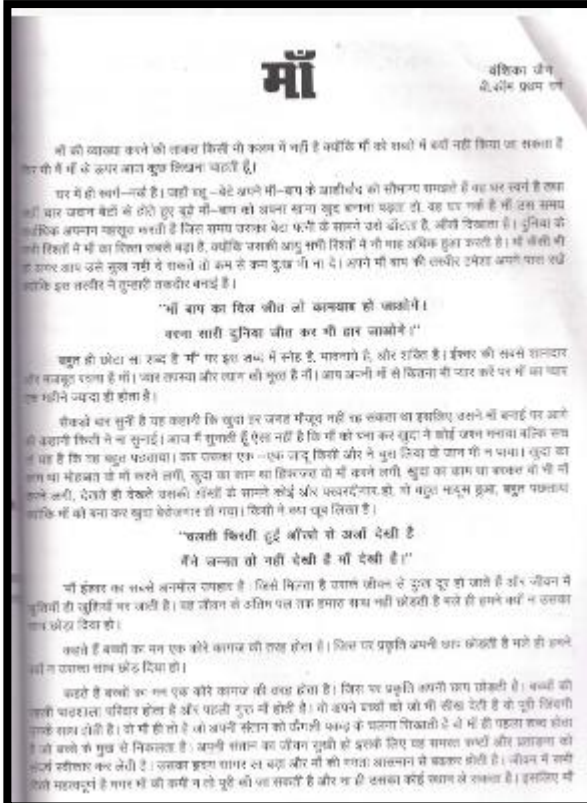
