Its vision is to position the cell as a distinguished platform dedicated to the holistic development of its members, enabling them to contribute positively to societal betterment.


The Women Cell has delineated several key objectives:

- Promote awareness of gender equity among students.
- Facilitate a paradigm shift in students' perceptions and attitudes concerning women's roles and rights.
- Stimulate active participation from female students, cultivating responsible and value-driven leadership.
- Champion the ideals of social and economic gender equality, as enshrined in the Indian Constitution, through community service initiatives.
- Engage with rural women, enlightening them about their legal and social rights, and empowering them to counteract gender-based violence and discrimination.
- · Instill core values, raise awareness, and foster leadership qualities within cell members.

Furthermore, the Women Cell emphasizes the importance of hygiene, striving to maintain a salubrious environment within and surrounding the academic institution. It equips its members with knowledge about their legal entitlements and mechanisms for grievance redressal. Periodically, the cell organizes seminars and lectures, inviting experts and distinguished speakers

to address topics such as preventing violence against women, addressing workplace sexual harassment, and promoting health and hygiene.

Committees

- 1. Anti-Ragging Committee: The college forms anti-ragging and discipline committee. The student in distress owing to ragging related incidents can access the committee. No case notified.
- 2. Redressal and Grievance Committee: The students are the main stakeholders in any institution imparting education, and it is our endeavour to make all efforts to ensure transparency in all the activities at different stages. Taking this spirit in consideration the college has decided to provide mechanism to students for redressal of their grievances which include the following complaints of the aggrieved students.
 - Academic & Non-Academic
 - Grievance related to Assessment, Victimization, Attendance, fees etc.
 - Grievance regarding Examinations
 - Harassment by colleague students or the teachers etc.
 - Girls are made aware of laws and by-laws by organizing lectures of eminent judges, lawyers and police personnel and awake the girl students for their privileges and duties.
 - The policy of this committee is to create zero tolerance to harassment.

The institutional Grievance Redressal Cell addresses the grievances of students as follows:

- A suggestions box placed at a strategic point in the college where students can drop their grievances. The suggestion box is opened weekly and then scrutinized.
- After which they are forwarded to the Principal.
- Principal takes the necessary action to resolve the grievances within a week.
- Students can approach the Principal for their grievances personally or through e-mail.
- A meeting of the Grievance Redressal cell is held every four months. The grievances are categories as academic and administrative and as per their categorization they are numbered and entered in the Grievance Redressal register.


Facilities for Girls in Campus

- Multigym: The College provides a separate multi-gym facility for ladies with latest amenities like 2 treademill, 1 cross trainer, 3 cycles, 1 twister and 10 pairs of dumbles of different weight.
- 2. Sports: The College ensures the participation of women students in various intra and interinstitutional sports competitions led by a women sports officer who train and encourage women participation. Best athlete award is given annually. Following events are organized for the girl students in which every year 150 girls participate.
 - Football, Handball, Volleyball, Cricket, Chess, Badminton, Table tennis, Kho-kho, Kabaddi, Hockey, Wrestling, Judo, Track & field events, Cross country race
- 3. Cultural: The cultural committee comprises of 90% woman staff who motivate and prepare women student for competing in cultural events at all levels.
- 4. NCC and NSS girls units: There are two NCC girls' units (Naval and Army) and one NSS girls' unit. Various programmes are organized aiming the female students to make them sensitize towards the issues of women foeticide, AIDs awareness and the girls are motivated to join these units
- 5. Ladies Room: Provision is made for girls resting mode in ladies room. There is an adequate place and silence is maintained for girls to study. This room is also equipped with Television, Water cooler and Sanitation Machine.
- 6. Girls Washroom: The washrooms for girls have been refurbished with modern amenities with clean environment. All the facilities are available in the Girls' Washroom.



- 7. Girls Hostel: The ladies hostel is provided with enhanced accommodation, adequate space, ambience and good location. The rules and regulation of Ladies Hostel are strictly implemented and students follow the same.
 - a) The ambience of women Hostel is much secured.
 - b) To ensure students participation in the housekeeping of the hostel and to maintain discipline, the students' representatives are appointed.
 - c) The warden Sr. Mercitta of the hostel provides home like atmosphere to the girls.
 - d) The students of the hostel celebrate basically all festivals like Holi, Diwali, Id, Christmas, Onam and others and the management of the hostel provides all the support for organizing these programmes.
 - e) Hostel management takes the responsibility for the sick students, provide the vehicle to take the student to the hospital and also accompany them.
 - f) Security guard is present for 24 hrs.
 - g) Indoor and outdoor game facilities are provided in the hostel like caroms, chess, badminton court, table tennis court etc.
 - h) Other facilities include the hostels are provided with 10 PCs with Wi-Fi internet connection to be used by the girls. It is fitted with solar heaters for hot water supply.
