




Plantation Program – Environment Day


Impact: By actively participating in Environment Day observances and tree plantation activities, the cadets cultivated a sense of environmental responsibility and civic duty.





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


Online Competition – Waste is Wealth

Impact: The interactive session encouraged students to think critically about innovative solutions to environmental challenges, fostering a sense of responsibility toward environmental conservation and sustainability.







