




NSS Day – Cleanliness Drive

Cleanliness Drive – Swachh Bharat Mission


Date: 19 October 2022

Awareness Program – Pollution Control Day


Date: 3 December 2022

Impact: Students developed effective communication skills by creating impactful slogans and posters to convey complex environmental issues clearly and concisely.








Environment Awareness Program

Plantation Activity – World Earth Day


Date: 24 April 2023
